Quantity	Species	Potential Height	Description
_____	Almond, Russian	3'-5'	A hardy, suckering shrub. Dense thicket excellent for wildlife.
_____	Buffaloberry	6'-14'	Attractive silver leaves. Red fruit can be used for jelly.
_____	Caragana	6'-14'	Very hardy & long-lived. Yellow flowers followed by seed bearing pods.
_____	Cherry, Nanking	12-20	Showy flowers and sweet red fruit. Good for jelly
_____	Chokeberry, Black (Aronia)	5'-8'	Shiny green foliage turns red/purple in fall. Tart fruit used in jelly.
_____	Chokecherry, Common	12'-25'	Suckering habit, fruit for jelly. Wildlife food & cover.
_____	Cranberry, Highbush	8'-12'	Red fruit for jellies. White flowers in the spring. Need 2 for pollination.
_____	Currant, Black	3'-6'	Small shrub, adapted to various soils. Edible fruit for jellies & wildlife.
_____	Currant, Golden	3'-6'	Small shrub, adapted to various soils. Edible fruit for jellies & wildlife.
_____	Dogwood, Redosier	7'-10'	Likes moist soil, but adaptable. Red bark, white flowers.
_____	Grape, Riverbank- (Vine)	20'-30'	Native Grape - may climb to height of 20 to 30 feet by tendrils. Jellies & wine.
_____	Honeysuckle	12-20'	Fragrant white, pink or red flowers. Inedible red or orange fruit.
_____	Juneberry	6'-15'	Dark purple, edible fruit, slow-growing
_____	Lilac, Common	8'-12'	Suckering habit. White to purple showy, fragrant flowers.
_____	Lilac, Villosa	6'-12'	Dense, non-suckering. Blooms later than common lilac. Pink flowers.
_____	Lilac, White	8'-12'	Same as common Lilac except has white flowers
_____	Plum, American	8'-10'	Suckering habit, thorny. Edible fruit for jellies. Need 2 plants.
_____	Rose, Hansen Hedge	4'-6'	Suckering habit, thorny. Single pink flowers, red rose hips.
_____	Silverberry	12-20'	Native. Suckering shrub with silvery leaves and fragrant flowers.
_____	Sea-buckthorn	10'-15'	Silvery-green foliage and orange fruit that persists through winter

Quantity	Species	Potential Height	Description
_____	Apple, Domestic	12-20'	Needs a cross pollinator; apples vary in size and color.
_____	Apricot	12'-16'	Small tree. White to pink flowers. Small edible fruit. Self pollinating.
_____	Aspen, Quaking	25'-60'	Bark color from chalky white to olive-gray. Needs moist site.
_____	Birch, Paper	30'-55'	Chalky white peeling bark when 3 or 4 years old. Nice ornamental tree.
_____	Boxelder	30'-60'	Relatively fast growing, short-lived tree of irregular form.
_____	Cherry, Black	25'-50'	Fruit more astringent in taste than chokecherry. Fragrant white flowers.
_____	Cottonwood, Native	60'-90'	Largest & fastest growing tree in the state. Native to moist soils.
_____	Cottonwood, Siouxland	40'-50'	Large, vigorous male tree, leaf rust resistant (cottonless). May reach 70 feet.
_____	Crabapple, Red Splendor	15-25	Hardy variety. Pink fragrant flowers, pea sized fruit, burgundy fall color
_____	Crabapple, Siberian	15'-25'	Hardy variety. White flowers, yellow fall color, pea-sized fruit.
_____	Elm, Siberian	25'-50'	Very hardy, fast growing with brittle wood subject to breakage.
_____	Hackberry	40'-60'	Native, good replacement for the American Elm (similar form).
_____	Hawthorn, Arnold	15'-20'	White flowers in the spring. NON-Edible fruit.
_____	Linden, American	50'-70'	Also called Basswood. Large stature, shade & aromatic flowers.
_____	Linden, Little Leaf	30'-45'	Medium sized, pyramidal to rounded crown. Flowers fragrant.
_____	Maple, Amur	15'-20'	Small specimen tree. Attractive reddish fall colors.
_____	Maple, Red	45'-65'	Medium to large maple. Prefers adequate moisture & neutral to acid soil pH.
_____	Maple, Silver	40'-65'	Fast growing. Often called soft maple. Subject to iron & manganese chlorosis.
_____	Oak, Bur	40'-70'	Slow growing, long-lived, large, hardy tree. Has deep taproot.
_____	Oak, Red	50'-75'	Long-lived with spreading crown. Leaves turn brownish-red in fall.

_____	Pear, McDermand	15'-35'	Small to medium, round headed tree. White flowers, small fruit.
_____	Poplar, Hybrid	40'-60'	Fast growing tree with narrow crown. Selected for insect & disease resistance.
_____	White, Poplar	40'-60'	Fast growing tree with "white" undersides of the the leaves.
_____	Walnut, Black	35'-60'	Valuable timber tree. Plant in protected sites.
_____	Willow, Golden	40'-55'	Round-topped crown with drooping branches. Good winter color.
_____	Willow, Laurel Leaf	25'-40'	Small to medium tree. Round topped crown. Flood resistant.

**Conifers 6"- 15"**

Quantity	Species	Potential Height	Description
_____	Eastern Red Cedar	30'-45'	Small tree with short trunk and irregular, pyramidal crown. Important for wildlife.
_____	Juniper, Rocky Mt.	20'-40'	Variable pyramidal to narrow crown. Good for wildlife.
_____	Pine, Ponderosa	50'-70'	Large conifer with pyramidal shape becoming irregularly oblong & open crowned.
_____	Pine, Scotch	25'-50'	Orange-brown peeling bark. Considered fastest growing evergreen in Midwest.
_____	Spruce, Black Hills	30'-60'	Dark green foliage & conical form. Fewer insect & disease problems.
_____	Spruce, Colorado Blue	30'-65'	Broad, dense, pyramidal conifer. More drought tolerant.
_____	Spruce, Meyer	40'-50'	Hardy. Similar in appearance to Colorado Blue Spruce. Growth slow to start out.
