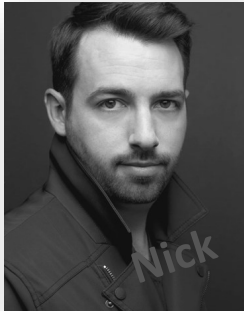

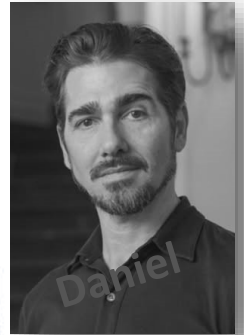

Kris Cangelosi Director of Weekend Workshops

Ballet and Lyrical

Kris is presently a member of Dance Educators of America, Dance Masters of America Chapter 3 and was voted 2023 STADT member of the year, and has served as a STADT board member for six years. Her students have received several overall National Awards winners in groups, duet, trio, and soloist for thirty-eight years as well as holding national title winners for over twenty years with DMA, Elite Dance Cup, KAR, Starpower, Mark of Excellence and many more. Kris taught at the prestigious faculty of Atlanta School of Ballet, Breanu University, Ballet Tennessee, Virginia School of the Arts, University of South Carolina, and several other schools for the past forty years. She has been a guest teacher at the International Ballet Competition in Jackson, MS, Dance Educators of America Nationals, South Carolina Summer Dance Conservatory, Tanzproject in Germany, Georgia Governors School and several others along the East Coast. Her choreographic works have been performed for the University of South Carolina dance program, Columbia Classical, Southeastern University, University of Lafayette, Ballet Tennessee, to name a few. She has received many reviews, recognitions and awards for her choreography at the Alabama Panoply Festival two-time overall choreographer winner, American College Dance Festival, Pacific Ballet Festival, New York City Fringe Festival, Jazz Dance World Congresses, Columbia Classical Ballet and The International Choreographers Showcase in Spain, Austria, Scotland and Lithuanian. She choreographed productions "A funny thing happened on the way to the forum", "Singin in the Rain" and "Best Little Whore House in Texas" for Theatre Baton Rouge Kris performed professionally for twenty years including companies in Atlanta with Several Dancers Core, Dance Force, Room to Move, Walt Disney Magical Moments held in Atlanta at the Fox Theatre and traveled with international showcase choreographers in Europe. She has judged and taught for Dance Masters of America, Dance Educators of America, KAR, Headliners, Encore Competitions and continues to judge for I Love Dance and Elite Dance Cup. Kris is the Artistic Director of the Cangelosi Dance Project School and Company. She continues to coach/mentor her students, choreographs for several charity events, continues to judge dance competitions and beauty pageants. Kris received the 2014 Louisiana Arts Leadership award, named 2014 Most Influential businesswomen, and 2023 Best Dressed honoree. She continues to serve on many charity event committees and board positions. She is a member of City Club Baton Rouge, Member of the Krewe of Artemis as Queen in 2016, and Krewe of Orion Queen Club Queen in 2021. She is a major sponsor for the Best Dressed Cancer Ball (Capital Gala), supports the Big Buddy program, Dancing for a Cause program, Quota BR, and continues to serve the community with dance performances through main stage shows and outreach performances. Kris received her BFA in dance/Choreography from Louisiana State University where she performed in the Modern and Ballet Company as well as on the dean's list. Kris recently Choreograph The Nutcracker for the Mississippi Gulf Coast Ballet Theatre and continues to teach ballet to the students at Gulf Coast School of Performing Arts under Artistic Director Elaine Kulick.



Nick Anthony Hip Hop, Commercial and Improv

Nick Anthony is an American artist, entrepreneur, and educator most well known as a professional dancer, choreographer, teacher, and actor. Originally from Southampton, Massachusetts, he grew up dancing, singing, and acting from the early age of 3. He studied at his mom and aunt's dance school, The Hackworth School of Performing Arts, which was started by Nick's great grandfather Gerrard Geoffrey in 1934, then called The Geoffrey School. Upon graduating high school in 2006, Nick attended Quinnipiac University in Hamden, CT to study Entrepreneurship, Small Business Management, and Music. Throughout college, Nick continued to dance, choreograph, teach, sing, and act. By the end of his junior year, he realized he wanted to continue these things professionally. Once he achieved his B.S. degree in 2010, he decided to relocate to Los Angeles to go after his dream of a career in the entertainment industry. Shortly following his move in 2011, Nick was able to lock down artistic representation and since then has worked with some of today's best dancers, choreographers, actors, directors, and educators in the industry. As a performer, Nick works as a dancer, actor, singer, and model and his credits span from film, tv, and music videos to commercials, web/internet shows, and live stage performances/shows. As a choreographer and teacher, Nick specializes in hip hop, contemporary, and acro. Being a fourth-generation dancer and having grown up in a studio, however, has allowed him to gain an extensive education in all genres of dance. This has enabled him to create his very own versatile and eclectic style of movement over the years. Since starting to choreograph and teach on his own at the age of 14, Nick has traveled the country, as well as parts of Canada and Central America, to work with studios, workshops, conventions, and students of all ages and levels, both in the classroom and on stage. He has set work for the NBA's D-League dance teams, as well as at several top competition studios on both coasts of the U.S. and has consistently received extremely high recognition, scores, & praise for what he does. Nick was also a contributing choreographer for the dance documentary film "Movement One" and was a featured choreographer for Candy Apples Dance Center on Season 3 of Lifetime's hit television show "Dance Moms." Most recently Nick worked alongside creative director/choreographer Anze Skrube as his assistant in helping to create youtube and violin sensation, Lindsey Stirling's, "Shatter Me" world tour, which is currently on the road for their US & European dates. Today, Nick continues to travel on a regular basis to perform, choreograph, teach, judge, and host. He hopes to inspire, educate, and entertain as many aspiring young artists as he can by sharing his work, knowledge, experiences, and passion. When not on the road, Nick auditions and works in LA as much as possible. Whether it be as an artist, entrepreneur, or educator, Nick is always trying to find and/or create work opportunities for himself and get involved in as many projects as he can, not only on the creative side of things, but on the business side as well. He has worked as a project manager for Travis Wall, Nick Lazzarini, Kyle Robinson, and Teddy Forance's dance company "Shaping Sound" and he has also served as the Executive Director for the Generation IV Dance summer workshop based out of MA. He currently has several of his own entertainment projects in development as well. When not working as a self-made entrepreneur on these projects, Nick continues to stay busy as a resident teacher at Liv' Art Studios and Relevé Studios in Los Angeles and is a frequent sub at Independence Dance Company and the world-renowned Millennium Dance Complex. He is also a faculty member for what has become one of the most highly anticipated and exclusive dance intensives held in the country each summer, Generation IV Dance, which is an event he had a big hand in helping to create when he served as the Executive Director for the first few years of the company's existence.



Daniel Therrien Tap Dance

Daniel Therrien returns to the Gulf Coast after 30 years on the World Stage. For three decades of performing, choreographing and directing across the globe, including the bright lights of Las Vegas, Broadway, Japan, Europe and beyond, Daniel is a proud Gulf Coast native and is back home in Biloxi, Mississippi.

He's journey began on the coast dancing at the Casino Magic and Isle of Capri before his talents took him to the biggest stages in the world including Las Vegas shows Folies Bergere, STOMP, Legends in Concert, Daniel performed in Cats, Wicked, Starlight Express, and Cirque du Soleil. He performed leading roles at the Salzburger Landestheatre, and Tokyo DisneySea. His choreographic credits include for Usher, Jimmy Buffett, Kenny Chesney and others as well as directing productions in Europe and Asia. He is the new co-owner of the Gulf Coast School of Performing Arts and serves as president of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Ballet Theatre where he leads the beloved productions like The Nutcracker.



Minori Therrien Musical Theatre

Minori Therrien is a distinguished musical theater performer, choreographer, director, and educator born in Nagoya, Japan. Her passion for the performing arts led her to enroll in the Vocal Musical Course at Nagoya University of the Arts in 2001. In 2002, she joined the renowned Shiki Theatre Company, Japan's premier musical theater company, launching a remarkable career that spans continents and disciplines. Minori's professional debut came with the Japanese premiere of Mamma Mia! at the renowned Umi Theater in Tokyo, where she performed as an original ensemble cast member. Her talent quickly propelled her to prominent roles, including Nala in The Lion King (touring Tokyo and Nagoya) and Nehebka in Elton John's Aida (touring Osaka, Kyoto, and Nagoya). She achieved a career milestone when she returned to her hometown of Nagoya to star as Aida in the same production. Minori's versatility shone in Tokyo's premiere of Wicked, where she portrayed the iconic role of Elphaba. Her final performance with Shiki Theatre Company was as the lead female vocalist in the original musical revue 55 Steps, capping an eight-year tenure filled with standout performances across Japan. Seeking new horizons, Minori relocated to Germany, where she continued to captivate audiences. She performed in the German premiere of Wicked in Oberhausen as part of the ensemble and toured Germany and Austria in Cats, embodying Grizabella, Demeter, and Tantomile. Her powerful portrayal of Anita in West Side Story at the Komische Oper in Berlin solidified her reputation as a dynamic performer. Minori also appeared as Lady Thiang in The King and I at Seefestspiele, Mörbisch in Austria, and took on roles in Hair (Deutsches Theater, Munich, and Salzburger Landestheater), Il Viaggio a Reims, The Rocky Horror Show, and the world premiere of Skiverliebt at the Salzburger Landestheater. Additionally, she played Calliope in Xanadu at the Red Bull Arena, showcasing her range across diverse productions. Beyond musical theater, Minori has appeared as a guest singer at numerous events, including the Expo in the Netherlands, and continues to perform at various stages and events worldwide. With a career spanning Japan, Germany, Austria, and beyond, Minori remains a celebrated figure in musical theater, known for her commanding stage presence and vocal prowess.
