"Pastoral Perspectives"

Most of the time, that sowing doesn't look spectacular. It may be a prayer whispered when no one else hears, an encouraging word spoken at just the right time, a visit made to someone who feels forgotten, or simply showing up week after week to worship and serve. These small acts, done in faith, are seeds planted in God's field. And the promise of Scripture is clear—there *will* be a harvest in God's timing.

The fruit God is looking for isn't measured in bushels but in hearts changed. It shows up in the way we love one another, forgive one another, and live out our faith in Christ day by day. Maybe you're tired right now. Maybe it feels like all the work, all the praying, and all the sowing hasn't made much of a difference. But God's Word says don't give up—"in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart." His timing is always right, and His promises never fail.

So this month, keep sowing. Keep trusting. Keep doing good in Jesus' name. The Lord of the harvest is faithful, and He sees every seed you've planted.

Prayer for October:

"Lord, give us strength when we are weary and hope when we are discouraged. Help us to keep our eyes on You, to keep sowing good seed, and to trust You with the harvest. Amen."

Challenge for the Month:

- Pray daily for three people: a family member, a neighbor, and someone who doesn't know Christ.
- Look for one way each week to quietly serve someone without expecting anything in return.
- Memorize Galatians 6:9 and let it encourage you when you feel tired.
