“Pastoral Perspectives”

There are seasons in our lives that feel like winter. Cold. Quiet. Heavy. Prayers seem to hang in the air. Circumstances feel frozen in place. Maybe you're walking through one of those seasons right now, a health struggle, financial strain, family tension, or a burden you don't speak about much. But hear me, dear friend: winter never gets the final word. The cross looked like winter. On that dark Friday, when our Savior hung between heaven and earth, mocked and bleeding, it looked like all hope had frozen over. The disciples scattered. The sky grew dark. The Son of God breathed His last. If you had stood there that day, you would have said, "It's over." But God was not finished. Buried in that borrowed tomb was not defeat, but victory waiting to break forth. And on the third day, spring broke through. The stone rolled away. Death was defeated. Jesus walked out alive. Hope stood upright. Church, we do not serve a Savior who stayed in the tomb. We serve a risen, reigning, conquering King. Because Jesus lives, your winter does not get the last word. Because Jesus lives, your sin does not get the last word. Because Jesus lives, death itself does not get the last word. Romans 5:8 says, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." While we were sinners, not cleaned up, not fixed, not worthy, He died for us. And when He rose, He conquered death for all who would trust in Him. Maybe this March you feel spiritually cold. Maybe you've drifted. Maybe you're simply weary. Let me remind you: Jesus specializes in resurrection. He restores what looks dead. He revives what feels dry. He breathes life into what we thought was finished. In John 11 He declared, "I am the resurrection, and the life." Life is not found in a church building or a preacher. Life is found in a Person. His name is Jesus. And when He speaks, graves open. As we move toward Easter, let us not rush past the wonder of the empty tomb. It is not just a historical event, it is the foundation of our hope. Because He lives, we can face tomorrow. Because He lives, all fear is gone, and we know He holds the future and life is worth the living just because He lives and the Gospel still saves. JRD
