

**Pastoral Perspectives

As we gather this July to celebrate Independence Day, our hearts swell with gratitude for the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of this country—freedom to speak, to worship, to live and work and raise our families in peace. But let us not forget that there is a **greater freedom**—a freedom not secured by soldiers on a battlefield, but by the Savior on a cross.

The Apostle Paul reminds us in Galatians 5:1 that we are to "stand fast" in the liberty that Christ has given us. This isn't just freedom from earthly bondage—it's freedom from the power and penalty of sin. Romans 6:22 tells us, "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life." What a promise! True liberty isn't the right to do whatever we want, but the power to do what is right—by the Spirit of the Living God.

In 2 Corinthians 3:17, Paul writes, "Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." Freedom and the Spirit go hand in hand. When we walk by the Spirit (Galatians 5:16), we no longer fulfill the lust of the flesh. We are led by the Spirit to bear fruit that reflects our new identity in Christ—"love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance" (Galatians 5:22–23).

And yet, with freedom comes responsibility. Paul warns us in Galatians 5:13, "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another." Freedom in Christ is not about pleasing ourselves—it's about loving God and loving others.

Let me ask you this, church family—are you walking daily in the Spirit? Or are you dragging around chains that Christ already broke? Are you living in the joy of your salvation or just going through the motions?

Here's the good news: every morning brings new mercy (Lamentations 3:22–23). Every moment is a fresh opportunity to say, "Holy Spirit, lead me today. Help me live like I've truly been set free." That's what it means to live by the Spirit. Not perfect, but surrendered. Not in chains, but in Christ.

This month, as the sky lights up with fireworks and patriotic songs fill the air, let's remember the greater freedom we have—a freedom not earned by our merit but by His mercy. Let's live by the Spirit, love one another, and shine like a light to a world still bound in darkness.

Let freedom ring—both in our nation and in our souls.
