But deeply important.

Until then, may we be found faithful.

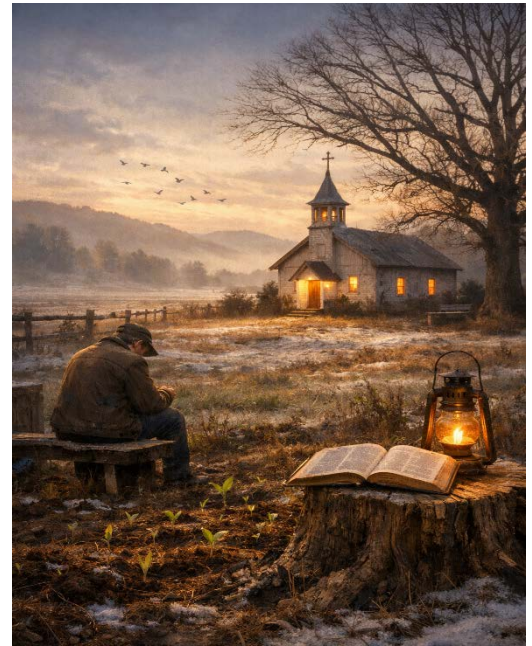
