BREAKING [Randwick City Council](#) staff have recommended that they **DO NOT** support Meriton's mega-development in Little Bay. Pleased to see this recommendation. It is the right one.

The matter will go to the Randwick Local Planning Panel on June 10 and then later to a full council meeting after that for decision.

This is an important first step in knocking back this concrete monstrosity - but remember, it is just the beginning and not the end.

Meriton will still have the right to apply directly to the NSW State Government for a final decision. They have already indicated their willingness to do so.

I will continue fighting this mega-development until the bitter end. 17 storey buildings do not belong in sensitive coastal environments with next to no transport links.
