Born into the heart of Southwest Florida's fishing culture, I carry with me the grit, wisdom, and deep respect for the waters that have shaped generations of anglers. My journey began in the backwaters and open Gulf, where old Florida mullet fishing and shrimping in the 1980s were more than just livelihoods-they were a way of life. I learned from seasoned fishermen who read the tides like a book, who knew every moon phase's secret, and who understood that true fishing isn't just about catching-it's about craftsmanship, patience, and tradition.

Since 2013, I've poured that heritage into custom fishing rod building, crafting each rod with the precision and durability demanded by serious anglers. My work isn't just about equipment- it's about honoring the legacy of Florida fishing and passing it down n, just

as those before me did. Whether guiding others, interpreting the rhythms of the water, or sharing the unwritten knowledge of the old Florida fishing world, Itake pride in keeping the spirit of these waters alive.

At this month's meeting I plan to talk a little about the science and artistry behind fishing rods, and reels, and cover a few artificial lures and techniques. We will cover the top five artificial lures and techniques for this area. I will mention a few different brands that are very effective and are readily available locally. I will be happy to answer questions to the best of my ability.
