I know, I know...some of you are thinking, "about time!"

Hopefully not too many of you are thinking that.



Really, as I've grown in ministry over these past 15 years, preaching has been one of my favorite responsibilities in this vocation. Some weeks I spend a lot of time wrestling with a text or in fierce debate with God about what the church needs to hear in this time and in this place about this text. But, overall, it's a joyful responsibility to step into the pulpit, look into the camera and attempt to unpack and discover what an ancient scripture might, with the help of the Holy Spirit, speak some deep and liberating truth into someone's life.

But, now, I'm taking a preaching class.

I thought it'd be fun.

Caitlin needs to take the class for her ordination requirements and it's online, so I thought it might be nice to accompany her on this journey and to be able to hear a few tidbits of wisdom. The class is through a respected seminary with deep Disciple roots and so I felt confident going in that our education would match my expectations.

But, I'm gonna be honest, this class is challenging me.

Not only because it's been a while since I've had so much reading and responding to do within a given timeframe; but also, because the professor's approach to homiletics (the art of preaching) is so different than mine. His central belief is that "every Sunday should solve a problem" and that "no one likes going to church" so our sermons should be less about what the Bible says and more, "what's in it for me (the listener)?" How will Jesus make your life better?

At first, I really wanted to push back or just drop out, but I think the healthier thing would be to discover why I'm so opposed to his philosophy. I wonder if there's something I can learn. I wonder if some of his criticism at the church hits a little too close to home.

I share all this, not because I want you to weigh in on preaching pedagogy, but because we all face some class, some teacher, some situation that we have a knee jerk reaction to. We might want to get away from it. We might want to complain about it.

But what if we stuck to it and asked, "God what are you trying to teach me in this moment? What can I learn from this discomfort? Is there something I can learn?"

At the end of the day, we may still stick with our old ways, our old wisdom. But I bet, we are better for the struggle, more able to know who we are and why we believe what we believe. So for all of you in seasons of struggle, whether it's a class, a health crisis, a political quandary or a family drama: may this be a great teacher and may we all be wise students.



For over 40 years, East Elm Apartments has been a ministry of FCC and other area churches to provide affordable, community-centered housing for seniors. We have done that so well that the apartments are at 100% occupancy. And the board has decided to sell the property to S and A Rentals, a company coowned by Sam Hines and Austin Rhodes, to manage the property going forward with the three core values of: affordable, community-centered, senior housing. The board is also in the process of transferring assets, which means FCC will receive their share of \$80-100,000, which will be used for other outreach and community-building ministries. Thanks FCC folks who have stewarded this ministry, including our current board representatives: Eugenia Warden, Susan Perez and Becky Wilcoxen.
