

Join us for a 6 week study on the theology and practice of hospitality. Discover the history, the challenges and gifts we have as individuals, and as church, to be a people of hospitality.





"There's no such thing as a free lunch!" My grandad was a strong advocate of this saying, always believing that if something didn't involve blood, sweat and tears, it probably wasn't worth having. He instilled in his kids and grandkids a strong work ethic and a desire to be independent and self-sufficient. I remember his legacy as so valuable for much of my better qualities and values I want to teach my kids.

And while this saying holds true for much of our lives, when it comes to faith and the love and support of God, maybe there IS such a thing as free lunch! Isaiah 55 is a memorable chapter in a prolific book of the Bible, one of Jesus' favorites. And at the start of chapter 55, is this invitation to God's people, "Listen up, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters. You who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." God is inviting us to an abundant feast of goodness and the only ticket we need for entry is to simply acknowledge we're hungry! It's a free lunch!

Even better, it's not just physical nourishment God is offering, but the very gift of life itself. Isaiah continues, "Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread and your earnings for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The rest of the chapter, Isaiah points out how all of Creation is set up in an interconnected pattern, where God doesn't waste anything and everything that is needed, God supplies.

This wisdom and imagery are the core ideas behind our stewardship emphasis that we'll be doing this month in worship, Satisfy the Hungry Heart: Feasting with God. All this month, we're going to be reminding each other of the good things God has given us and desires for us to share with one another. In our worship series, we will explore scripture, sing songs, as well as hear from people about what feeds them at God's table and how they've extended the invitation for others. We'll talk about our own personal practices to help make sure that the things we spend our time and energy on really connect us to the nourishment of God so that our hungry hearts might be deeply satisfied.

Because for so many of us, church is that place where we find our meaning, the community where we are known and fed; we can also consider what our stewardship practices can be. As we look to fund the ministries God is calling our church to in 2026, we need to know that this community is ready to extend a welcome table, to feast with God and share the goodness God has given us so that we can continue to be a church leading in love and discipleship going forward. So join us this month as we celebrate together ***Satisfy the Hungry Heart: Feasting with God***



THEOLOGY OF HALLOWEEN

Halloween: the name itself comes from "All Hallows' Eve," of course, the night before All Saints' Day, a carnival-like inversion celebrating the shadow side of life - ghosts and ghouls and the like - just before the great festival celebrating the saints. Its deep roots may well include folk traditions of honoring the dead, appeasing evil spirits, and marking the end of the summer harvest and the beginning (in the Northern hemisphere, at least!) of the darkest days of the year.

But whatever its origins, Halloween today is worth thinking about. It's now arguably the second-most-popular holiday in North America (second only to Christmas!), and at its best, it's above all a magical, playful night of community-building and neighborhood-making. From this point of view, we might even call it a sacramental glimpse, if only for one night, of how the world is supposed to be: homes decked out in mischievous fun, front doors thrown wide open to visitors of all ages, a spirit of wit and excitement in the air, and simple, sweet gifts distributed to children (all children, not just "our" children!) dressed up as heroes and villains alike.

It's easy to grumble about "all that sugar," "marauding teenagers," "a waste of time," and so forth. But think of it: when else do we intentionally spend this kind of time together as a community? When else do we do something as a neighborhood that's this intergenerational? This open to all? This playful, witty, and plain old fun? When else do our front doors swing open to so many strangers? And when else are so many gifts given out - gifts often given by strangers, to strangers - just for the sake of delight?

And there's an even deeper side to all of this, too: in many neighborhoods, lines of social division - segregated lines of race and class, for example - are often crossed on Halloween night. In such moments, Halloween can become an all-too-brief time of sharing experiences and resources, catching sight of a true "commonwealth" too often obscured from view on the other 364 nights of the year. And what's more, there's now some intriguing social science showing a strong correlation between a community's health and the extent to which it celebrates Halloween.

At its best, then, Halloween amounts to a vivid portrait of what "neighborhood" actually looks like. That alone is worth celebrating. And after all, what better way to honor the dead, prepare to celebrate the saints, and enter together the darkest time of the year than to embody - with equal parts creativity and joy - the "loving our neighbors as ourselves" to which Jesus calls us every day?—saltproject.org
