From Hank

The year 2020 has certainly been unusual. Over 12 months, we have dealt with a pandemic, a racial reckoning, and a divisive election. Any of those would have created a year to remember. To deal with all three has been almost overwhelming. Things haven't gone exactly the way we expected at Canton FCC either. The implementation of our ministry plan was delayed, the search for a new pastor was put on hold for several months and, of course, we have not been able to worship in person for much of the year.

While 2020 has been challenging for our church, there have been positives. We have learned new ways to do ministry, especially the use of Facebook, Zoom and the web to extend the reach of our church. People have stepped up in a variety of ways to help us through this time. And our congregation has continued to be generous in its financial support. All of these are significant and have brought about results for which we can be thankful.

What will 2021 hold? None of us, of course, knows. We all hope and pray that it will be better. We do know that the new year will bring new lay leadership to the congregation. We know that it will likely bring new pastoral leadership to the congregation. And that we will continue to explore new ways to do ministry. We hope that we will be able to return to some form of normalcy and especially that we will be able to begin gathering in person once again. But it is most likely that the new normal will be entirely like the pre-pandemic normal.

So, what can you do as Canton FCC moves into a new year? Several things.

First, pray. You can pray for the church in general. You can pray for the lay leadership. You can pray for the search committee. You can pray for guidance, wisdom, and courage as we move forward. And, of course, I would welcome your prayers as will the new pastor whenever she or he arrives.

Second, participate. You can participate in whatever way is available. For the first part of the year at least, that will largely happen remotely. But you can join our online worship services. You can join our Bible study groups. You can participate in any committees or groups that you are part of. And, of course, whenever we begin gathering in-person again, you can participate then as well.

Third, support. As I mentioned earlier, the congregation has been very generous. But things did tighten up towards the end of the year. It is, of course, important that the church remain strong financially as the new year begins and to prepare the way for a strong start for a new pastoral ministry. I realize that this is a difficult time financially for many but encourage all to reflect on their financial support of the church and its ministry.

Finally, trust. Continue to trust that God is working in this time. The road ahead will bring its challenges, but we can know that God is present throughout, that this is God's church and he desires it to be strong, that we are God's people and that God will continue to work through us.

An email this morning reminded me of one of my favorite passages of scripture: "*Behold, I am making all things new* (Revelation 21:5). May your new year and our new year together be filled with God's blessings!
