Rocky Railway Vacation Bible School July 25-29th, 2021 from 5:40p.m.-8:00p.m.

This year we are not offering a meal.

We are requiring all volunteers to be vaccinated since they will be working with youth who cannot be. If you do not wish to be vaccinated you can still support VBS by donating items for the take home snacks or items to be used during VBS. We appreciate all the support we receive from our congregation to make VBS run so well!

Positions we still nee filled:

Cam Track: You perform with the VBS Leader in the opening skit each day as a train engineer. The character is a little goofy. You would not be required to stay for all of VBS if you take this role.

Bible Adventures: Each day you will tell a story that goes along with the bible point for the day. Some days have skits involved and activities. You will need to do some cutting to the stories that are provided to fit in the 20 minute time slots we have. If you take on this role you need to be able to make adjustments during the stories to allow for questions/ responses from the children. Some groups are extremely responsive so they will get less of the scripted story than others.

This year we are requiring that participants register ahead of time, **by July 19th**. We want to be sure none of the groups are too big. Get numbers ahead will allow us to rearrange some of the groupings if needed. We will also do stick on name tags this year instead of lanyards.

"Who do *you* say that I am?" This question that Jesus answers Peter is, to some scholars, the most pivotal question in the gospels and some even consider it the advent of Christianity. Up until then the disciples had been observing Jesus, remarking on what other people said about Jesus—but Jesus asks them to personally claim their own thoughts. Because in that moment that Peter is able to respond, "you are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God!" he is making the first statement of faith, the first baby steps of articulating and owning his own discipleship. In other words, in naming Jesus as Messiah, Peter is also taking responsibility for how his life will be transformed—he's naming that how he lives, how he treats his neighbors, how he orders his time will all be based on this confession of faith.

At all times this question of, "who do *you* say that I am?" is asked of churches. This is maybe no more so important than in this moment of history we find ourselves in—after decades of institutional decline, churches have had to be clear about who they are—what their mission calls them to do and what they need to let go of. And while we could wring our hands about youth sports and stores being closed on Sundays, missing overflowing Sunday school classes and pastors being invited to offer opening prayers at city council meetings—we must be honest with ourselves that we can't change that. We're never going back to that time in our culture, for better or worse. And now, that we're coming out of a global pandemic, we're even more aware that we need to be clear about who we are, how we're specifically called to serve and who our neighbors are. It is our collective response to, "who do you say that I am?"

I'm grateful this church has **amazing** leadership, a community-own vision and that we are gifted through our regional church with a new neighborhood analytics tool designed to help us not just guess, but to know what the gifts and needs of our neighbors are. And after two months of meetings, worship services, everyday conversations and our "Get to Know You" gatherings, I'm starting to get a sense of what our response might be to Jesus' urgent question of First Christian. I'll work with our board and leadership to make sure we continue to clarify, communicate and live out our vision in a way that helps us not only internally know who Jesus is to us; but to help us clearly invite and welcome our neighbors to serve the Messiah, the Living God!

Safe Kid's Training:



We had a training on Thursday June 10th at 6p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Michelle Spiva did a wonderful job leading the training. If you were unable to attend you can watch the training on Facebook. It is only 40 minutes long! We have not offered a training

in over 3 years, therefore everyone needs to go through training again.

The DCFS Mandated Reporter Training is separate from the training above. Once you complete this step send the certificate to Misti to be placed in your volunteer folder. This training is in addition to the regular Safe Kid's Training but only needs to be done 1 time. There are a few people who have struggled with this online process so we will provide this in person on 7/13/21 at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Misti will put the training on the T.V. & walk the group through the slides. At the end you will be given 13 multiple choice questions to answer and that will serve as your certificate instead of creating the online account. (You have to answer the same questions online if you do it independently.)

The POLICY & PROCEDURES for the Protection of Children and Youth was updated by the Christian Education Committee and Approved by the board on 11/18/19. Some of the biggest changes include:

- Training will be offered annually, but individuals are only required to attend training once every 3 years. Training will only be an hour long, instead of an all day event!
- Completion of online DCFS Mandated Reporter Training. This is a new requirement that we have added in. https://mr.dcfstraining.org.
 - ♦ This is a free training that consists of videos and multiple choice questions. It takes about 60 minutes to complete & can be done at home online. There are 13 multiple choice questions.
 - ♦ This needs completed only 1 time, not every 3 years.
 - We have added this so that we can hold training just 1 time a year, as opposed to every time we get a new volunteer or staff member.
 - ♦ This also allows for the training to consist of more than just going over signs of abuse for the majority of the time.
 - ♦ The videos goes over the various types of abuse/neglect and how to proceed. They also clearly shows the difference between abuse/neglect and you not agreeing with parenting decisions.
 - ♦ The website has many resources available other than just the training video. There are many documents, report forms, and signs, if you need more clarification.

Scholarship forms may be picked up from Misti. They should be returned along with most recent high school or college transcript by **August 1**, **2021**.


