Similarly, one of the reasons I love going to the General Assembly (GA) conferences held by the Disciples denomination, is the opportunity to step outside of what I regularly know and love about church to witness the many other ways that church can be, even within our own tradition. I've been going to GA since I've been in college and I haven't missed one of these every-two-year gatherings—other than 2021's Assembly, which was cancelled, due to COVID. That's why I've been especially interested in seeing who else from FCC is interested in joining me this July 29-Aug 1 in Louisville for 4 days of worship, dialogue, exploring and connection-building.

In years past, GA has helped me learn new ways of worshipping—including the idea for a Pray Ground!; it's been a time of discovering potential mission partners and meeting with leaders from the general church to learn how we can grow. I've been to seminars on clarifying vision, on updated approaches to stewardship, on how to clarify our communications approach...and all along the way, GA is always punctuated by rekindling an existing relationship and meeting someone new who has been a gift!

For this GA in Louisville, the theme is "The Kin-dom of God is Within Us and Among Us." At FCC, we'll be preparing all our hearts, not just those of us who will go to Assembly, by exploring the themes and scriptures that will be used at GA throughout our July worship services. But at GA, I'm looking forward to the hearing in worship from our General Minister and President, Rev. Terri Hord Owens, as well as Owen chandler, an old friend from Bethany Fellows who is a US Army Chaplain and I'm sure has much wisdom to share after his 5 deployments. I'm also intrigued to see how Rev. Yolanda Norton will be guiding us in worship, considering she is the creator of the Beyonce Mass—if that intrigues you, definitely Google it! There's something new that should be reviving to the soul: there are 5 resident artists who will be bringing beauty to our days! At GA, there's also some work to be done, that's a part of the Covenant Project, where we're looking at updating the church's by-laws and changing GA to a once-every-three-years event and making the role of congregational representatives a much more important and ongoing role.

For those who have been doing Bible Study with me this past month when we've been talking about the Holy Spirit, we've talked about Cane Ridge—well, there will be trips to that site, where the Disciples began as a revival. I'm also excited to explore the Muhammad Ali museum, who called Louisville his home, and I'm sure there will be plenty of good bluegrass and maybe a bit of local bourbon along the way. I'm even going to participate in a Habitat house build—inside the convention center!—and learn from the Week of Compassion some helpful hints on disaster preparedness.

Jump for Joy! It's Camping Season!




