Welcome our new Office Coordinator



Some people's favorite religious holiday is Christmas—I know that's my kids'! Many people love the springtime joy and new life of Easter. I love both of those. Lots of good food and fun celebrations. Maybe there's somebody out there really jazzed about Pentecost or some other holy day, but for me, my favorite Christian holiday is Ash Wednesday.

Favorite might not even be the best word, but it's the day that is always puts me on a roller coaster of a gut punch, makes me tear up and makes me stop thinking about church as much as it makes me feel so deeply grateful and reliant on the Living God! That's Ash Wednesday to me—a holy day of experiencing the great gift and terrifying truth of our mortality and what Jesus means to our lives.

If you have no idea what I mean, maybe it's just a pastor thing. Maybe you should join me—seriously, let me know if you want to—but it's both the most humbling gift and some of the hardest thing to one-by-one look at people you love and remind them that they're gonna die. This Ash Wednesday I put ashes on someone whose sister had died that morning, others who have had close calls with health this year, others living with terminal illnesses. I'll never forget Ash Wednesday of 2014 when I put ashes on Isaac's 3-week-old head and said aloud that someday he would die. Those words got stuck in the back of my throat. This year, Isaac, threw his arms around me before he received his ashes and I hope to live up to that embrace.

Some people even have the kind audacity when I put the cross on their head to say, "thank you." I don't know if that's just really nice, polite people who want to say something in response, but all I can say in response is "amen"—may it be so with my soul. "You're welcome" just wouldn't seem to cut it. I do try and gently squeeze a shoulder without getting drippy, oily ashes on someone's nice clothes—but I feel we all need some gentle touches of love and affirmation with such a raw and real day.

One young man, came up but before receiving ashes, his mom, leaned past his shoulder and said, "he's afraid." I thought, "wise kid." And so I showed him the bowl of ashes, I looked him in the eyes, and he nodded, before I slowly and gently made the cross and repeated those words, "remember you are human. From dust you came and to dust you will return." It really is a scary thing that we say in Ash Wednesday, that despite all our attempts, our diets, our wealth, our workout regimens, no matter how many glasses of water we drink or our sleep schedules, we're gonna die. But that is also the extravagant grace and gift we receive in Ash Wednesday, because when we put that cross on our heads, we say that we're going to experience the scariest thing we can think of—death—and that Jesus is going to hold us tight and love us and carry us through even that. So we don't have to be afraid of this death or living fully this life.

My prayer is that this Lent as we come face-to-face with ourselves, as we seek to better "Know Thyself" that we can trust Jesus goes with us into all the hard places, that we can name them and cover them with a sign of hope, like the cross. That we wear our im-




