Re-Entry Committee Notes:

The Re-Entry Committee met on Wednesday, April 7 via Zoom. Not a lot of changes for FCC are being recommended at this time. What follows is a summary of the committee's discussion:

- First and foremost, we will continue to follow the CDC and State of Illinois Guidelines for group meetings.
- Sunday worship services will continue as they have been. We will continue to
 - ◆ Take attendance in case contact tracing is needed.
 - ◆ Take temperatures at the entry door.
 - ◆ During Children's Moment, kids present may be asked to stand where they are rather than come up front where distancing could be hard to arrange if there is a large group.
 - Singing can continue with masks on.
 - ◆ Actual serving of communion will not start up yet. Communion packets will still be provided but people are encouraged to bring their own communion elements if they don't like the packets.
- Kids' activities
 - ◆ Chi Rho may continue with their planned activities using the guidelines that Michelle Spiva has set up (masks, distancing, pre-packaged snacks, etc.)
 - ◆ Family Night may start up using the same guidelines as Chi Rho.
 - ♦ We encourage meeting outside whenever possible.
 - ◆ Larger children's activities, including Children's Church, may possibly begin with VBS, depending on the status of the pandemic at that time. VBS is scheduled for the week of July 25.
- Church Use -
 - ◆ Funeral services, but not visitations, may be held at FCC as long as protocols are followed, i.e. masks are worn, distance seating is followed, temperatures are taken, and the numbers attending fit with our sanctuary guidelines. Visitations will have to be held at a funeral home or elsewhere.
 - ◆ Funeral meals will not be available at this time.
 - ◆ The church is NOT available for outside group's use.
- Bus Ministry
 - ◆ The bus ministry will not start back up until all restrictions are lifted. Distance seating is not possible on the bus for the wheelchairs, and to assist the blind and semi-ambulatory there would have to be physical contact.

The Re-Entry Committee for FCC continues to be cautious in recommending guidelines for the safety and well-being of our members. These guidelines will be revisited as state-wide restrictions open up, local Covid numbers decrease, and more people are vaccinated. Please be patient with the recommended restrictions and know that the guidelines above have been carefully and prayerfully considered.

I'm excited (and honestly, a bit nervous) to begin as your pastor—preaching, listening, learning, building relationships with y'all. 


Canton First Christian Church Family Ministry Nights are Back!!!

Join Us **Sunday May 23rd at 5PM** at Big Creek Park Pavilion to take a Nature Walk and make Journey Sticks with the treasures we find!

All ages welcome! You can even just join us for the walk and fellowship!

What is a Journey Stick? Native Americans and Aboriginal people used them to track their journeys and tell stories about their travels. Items collected on a journey would be tied to a large stick in the order that they were found. Symbols could also be painted or carved onto the stick. Each item on the stick would help to build up a picture of the journey, including things such as natural features, weather and adventures. The stick would then be used as a prompt for the retelling of the journey upon return, and also as a way to navigate the trip in the future.



We will provide paint, colored floss, ribbon and charms to add to your stick. If you have a nice big stick at home that is good for walking, bring it along to decorate, or find one during the walk.
