

Even though our budget and leadership years go January thru December, and our liturgical calendar of worship beings each year with the first Sunday of Advent (usually right after Thanksgiving), it always feels like this time of year is not only Back-to-School, but it's a fresh start for the church, as well. At FCC, we're beginning a new season of choir, children's church and we're trying a new ministry that has worked in the past to deepen discipleship in this church, one that was highlighted in every one of the "get to know you" conversations last year: **small groups!** 

Small group ministry is just what it sounds like. While Sunday morning worship is vital to "growing in the Holy Spirit;" small group ministries help us in "becoming dedicated disciples" as we develop those essential prayer and devotional practices with a group of people that we share a common bond with. While I'm hoping we can make small group ministries a central part of our ministry in the future, I think it's always good to start small, try something out and then assess the results so we can see if these small group ministries could be beneficial for our community going forward.

To kick us off in these small groups, we'll try a model called "**Praying Our Lives.**" This model does one of the most important things we can in church: empowering people to tell their story and discover God in the midst of it. We're hoping for groups of 6-10 people, meeting in homes or at church where each week a person from the group would share a story from an important time in their life and then the group will actively listen and help process the story. Each person will have an opportunity to share and to listen. I've found small groups and this specific model to be very powerful in connecting us with one another and with the Holy Spirit. These groups won't begin until October, but I hope you'll start thinking now about committing to a group.

For these next two months, you'll be hearing a lot in worship and in scripture about why small groups are so important! We'll be reminded that God made us with a desire to celebrate together, as one body with many gifts; that we are called to walk through life with one another, praying with one another, sharing and listening to each other's holy stories; and when we do these things, the Holy Spirit can lead us on God-sized adventures. So especially if you need some convincing that something amazing can happen when we show up for each other, I hope you'll join us for worship.



I'm encouraging you to prayerfully consider joining a "Praying Our Lives" group—or if you'd even be willing to facilitate a group as host. Please contact me if you know you want to either participate or lead in this setting. I believe small groups and "Praying Our Lives" will help your faith journey and worth making a priority in your life. This may be something new for you, it may mean letting go of something else, but don't forget, now is a perfect time to kick off something new!



Well, it is Saint Jude run time. We are running from Canton to Peoria today! We are always trying to raise money to help the kids at Saint Jude. This year is no different. We have shared with all of you some of the stories like of Ava Leitze's journey with a rare, aggressive cancer AML. Acute Myeloid Leukemia. donor in Harper, Ava's youngest sister. Harper bravely donated bone marrow to save Ava's life. The family spent seven months in Memphis at Saint Jude's, receiving treatment and recovery. We insistent to donate our time, money and this race to Ava and

her family and Saint Jude. Through faith, the power of prayer, and the talented doctors and nurses at Saint Jude Ava is at home now feeling better and recovering. We need to help them out as much as we possibly can so that every child with cancer can be cured. I'm going to include some pictures of Ava as she went through her treatment. Tickets are \$10/adult (which includes 3 wine tastings) and all children are free.






