There's no clear answer, it seems like any road forward will be imperfect and no real guaranteed of success? And then someone unhelpfully suggests you just read your Bible. As though the Bible was a Magic Eight Ball, with the ability to answer every question you've had in a short, clear statement. Or, if you grew up, as I did, with friends that would encourage you to randomly open a page of the Bible, and with your eyes closed, point to a scripture that was supposedly going to answer your deepest questions and concerns. I don't know your track record with treating the Bible as a go-to for easy and clear answers in modern language with culturally-relevant responses, but for me, it very rarely worked that way.

For even the most biblically literate and faithful folks, the Bible is still a complex book—actually a collection of 66 books (unless you're Catholic, there's another 7 books, but that's another story)—written by many authors over centuries in different languages, edited and translated into more language over even more years. Our Bible contains history, poetry, propaganda, letters to individuals and communities; and most of these texts are written for ancient agrarian, clan-based societies shaped by ancient Greek philosophy. And as much as we modern American Christians might hope the Bible would be a straight-forward, self-disclosive, book of self-help, or the ways we treat it that way, it isn't.

The Bible is complicated. There are teachings that seemingly contradict each other. So while the Bible can be beautiful, motivating, can show us how other folks have searched for and found the Holy...most of it isn't direct and simple. (Even to a pastor—shh, don't tell anyone that!)

But that's good news.

First because, as church, we have the gift of reading and studying scripture together—which I hope we'll be able to announce ways to do that soon.

Secondly, it's good news because James is such a biblical breath of fresh air. James is direct and straightforward. It's accessible and a practical guide to help us live Christ-shaped lives to not only help us be more faithful Christians, but better people. All month long in Sunday worship, we'll work our way through the Letter of James in our worship series James and the Giant Preach. James wants us to find inner peace that can support us in difficult seasons, to use our words wisely, to act in ways that support vulnerable folks and to remember that we're all in this together. James is that rare biblical gem that does easily translate to our world, that offers us simple ways to practice what we preach and that doesn't take a degree in philosophy to understand.

I hope you will join us this (and every!) month in worship for James and the Giant Preach. It'll be an especially good chance for you to invite your neighbors, family, co-workers or friends to share in the good news and wisdom James shares with us. See you then!

I'm hopeful, flexible, and patient and can live peaceably with just about anybody. The way I stay in that healthy space is in collaborative, celebratory communities that can creatively work towards a shared gospel vision.

Also, I'm passionate about music making as a holy and joyfilled pursuit and hope to put my vocal gifts to use.

Well – Steve - we love that you are passionate about music making and we too hope that you are able to put your gifts to use. And you, as well, Caitlin.
