Where the Bible is silent, we are silent." This sounds nice for a church that is founded on the concept that we are a "priesthood of all believers"—that each of us has the ability to read, interpret, and lead in our faith and discipleship.

Just one problem. While the Bible is still the most popular and influential book of all time, it seems no one likes to read it. According to a recent survey: only 11% of Americans read the Bible daily and 33% say they've never read any of the Bible on their own. How are we supposed to know what, how, when and why to speak, if we don't know what the Bible says?

And I get it. The Bible is a complicated book—or more accurately, a library of books. It was written over centuries, millenia ago, by people from cultures very different from ours. It was written in different languages, has different translations, that even have a different number of books! No wonder it's not on everyone's audible list!

But there is still a need, maybe now more than ever, for biblical literacy. As we say on our website, at First Christian Church, we don't take the Bible literally, but we take it seriously. And that is because, the Bible speaks to the deepest, most pressing issues of our world, and in our own lives...if we can just understand it better and get more comfortable with it.

That's why we're having our Bible Basics study Wednesday nights during Lent. Starting March 12th and continuing each Wednesday—except for our 6th and final lesson which will be on Maundy Thursday, April 17th—we'll be gathering weekly from 5:30-7pm in the FCC Fellowship Hall for group a soup supper, study and discussion of the Bible. We'll talk about what is the Bible, where'd it come from, what's its purpose...all before taking a look at some of the big themes and sections of scripture. Each week, we'll begin with dinner and fellowship before spending some time as I talk about the Bible and then we open our Bibles to engage scriptures together, using our hearts and our brains in the process. Each week, we'll also use some of the engaging videos from the good folks at "The Bible Project" to guide our conversation.

Recently the FCC board, cabinet and elders met for a leadership retreat. We reaffirmed our structure—the board handles governance, finance and administration; the elders are the spiritual leaders; and the cabinet oversees programming and ministry of the church. We also asked committee chairs to create job descriptions to help with leadership expectations and transitions.


We admitted that the discipleship committee needs our attention. This vital part of our leadership is tasked with evangelism of sharing our message beyond the current membership of the church, helping cultivate first-time visitors into equipped leaders in the church, and providing programming to help deepen the discipleship of our adults. But ever since being created 6 years ago, it's never been functional. So, if you feel called to help jumpstart discipleship, know we are excited to support you!

We also talked about our mission with children and youth, as we named growth in the number of children and youth, with some moderate growth in programs designed for them. We also

brainstormed ideas of new ministries for youth.

In the afternoon, we talked about hospitality and welcome—especially as it related to welcoming marginalized communities—immigrants, LGBTQ, people of color, etc. To that end, we are going to explore becoming "Open and Affirming" (a ministry designation for Disciples congregations who are welcoming to everyone, expressly LGBTQ folks). As a first step, we are going to be doing a book study soon on the book "Making Room: Recovering Hospitality as a Christian Tradition" by Christine Pohl. Past Steve will lead it.

In a nutshell, this was a day where our leadership: remembered our respective ministry roles, committed to making them a success, came up with some ideas on furthering our youth ministry and invited us to explore becoming "Open and Affirming." It was a full day, full of laughs, of stories, guided by prayer and with a spirit of grateful praise to God for all that we've done and all we might do in the name of Christ!
