I have never gone to this before because…well, did you hear the todo list?! But this year, I needed to make the commitment, not only because it's important to honor my covenantal commitments to the regional church, but also because this year's theme was on Sabbatical and Sabbath Renewal. I wanted to hear from others who had gone through sabbaticals and their congregations come out just as, if not more, healthy and revitalized as their pastors.

And so, I ventured to St. Joseph, Michigan, a place I've never been to on the sandy shores of Lake Michigan for our retreat. I met some new colleagues, rekindled relationships with others and ate way too much good food. There were definitely some handy sabbatical ideas—put up a map with pictures during sabbatical so the congregation can keep up, have an FAQ booklet to help the church navigate any potential questions, come back on a Sunday without any duties so that everyone can say hi and then be ready to catch up with office work the next day.

But in a panel discussion, one of our presenters said something that really caught my attention that I think applies not only to clergy navigating sabbaticals, but to so many of us in our culture that values work to an unhealthy level. He said, "Sabbatical is a chance to ask ourselves the question: what am I besides a pastor? Sometimes we've mistaken what we've been trained to do with who we are." We've mistaken what we've been trained to do with who we are.

You, me, all of us, are more than what we do, what we earn, what tasks we can accomplish. That is one of the best parts of the good news in God. It's a foundational part of what we try and embody each sabbath Sunday—you have intrinsic value as a beloved child of God, and you don't need to "earn your keep" in God's eyes. It takes commitment to affirm our worth. As Hebrew Bible scholar fiercely argued, we need to see "Sabbath as resistance."

So next time you are guilted into doing something you don't want, or you worry that you haven't worked hard enough at something, or you think people will only value you for what you can give to them, remember...you are God's beloved child and you don't have to do anything for this great gift.

Recently, other items purchased with memorial funds include the Walnut/Brass cross on the communion table; the Care Notes handouts; the bench at the entry doors as well as the lovely wooden bench in the Narthex. The Christian Ed and Finance Committees have been working with the Meade family to continue Mike's desire that all Canton 2nd graders should have at least one book. That project will continue because of donations in memory of Mike.

Memorial moneys are being put to good use in many ways to enhance the worship experience at First Christian. If the funds are designated specifically for FCC, they stay at the church. Thanks to the families and friends who continue this tradition.
