## ORDINANCE 2024-778

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. MARIES, IDAHO ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 01, 2024, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$8,750,654.50 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF ST. MARIES FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR, AUTHORIZING A LEVY OF A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY AND SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SAID APPROPRIATION IS MADE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of St. Maries, Benewah County, Idaho:

Section 1: That the sum of \$8,750,654.50 is, and the same hereby is appropriated to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of St. Maries, Benewah County, Idaho for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024.

Section 2: The objects and purposes for which such appropriation is made, and the amount of each object and purpose is as follows:

Section 3: That a general tax levy on all property within the City of St. Maries be levied in an amount allowed by law for the general purpose for said City, for the fiscal year beginning October 01, 2024.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon passage, approval, and publication in the Gazette Record, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of St. Maries, and the official newspaper of said City.

Passed under suspension of rules upon which a roll call vote was taken and duly enacted an Ordinance of the City of St. Maries, Benewah County, Idaho at a convened meeting of the City of St. Maries City Council held on the 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2024.
