CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

1. Call to Order.

The regular meeting of the St. Maries City Council was called to order by Mayor Tom Carver at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, August 8, 2025, in Council Chambers at City Hall, 602 College Avenue, St. Maries, Idaho.

2. Roll Call.

3. Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Carver led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Consent Calendar – action item

Mayor Carver noted for the record the amount of expenses presented for payment approval, as shown below. Clerk, Jaidyn Kinzer, stated that there was an error on the draft August 7, 2025, meeting minutes and will need to add Councilors Winters and Spooner as attendees.

Public Hearing: Appeal for water service denial to property located outside of City Limits (550 Rimrock and 562 Rimrock Drive). - action item Jaidyn Kinzer, City Clerk, introduced the appeal request, stating that the request to connect to the City's water system outside of city limits was denied at the time of the request due to Resolution No. 2023-321. Public Works Director, Shiloh Pfeiffer, stated the lots were approved for city water when River Pine Estates was first developed in 1987 and explained that the facility plan, that was done in 2012 and updated by HMH Engineering in 2019 does not mention Rochet Creek capacity levels, only the water treatment plant. Pfeiffer stated that the City is running the wells and foresee running them for the remainder of the year. The applicant, Mitch Santos of 562 and 550 Rimrock Drive, St. Maries, Idaho, presented his request as to why he should be allowed to connect this property located at 562 and 550 Rimrock Drive into the City water system. Santos stated that he would be adding a new shop to these lots for storage and would like to have a restroom area, which usage would be very minimal. There were no questions for staff or applicant by Councilors at this time. The public hearing was open at 6:03 p.m.. There were no written comments. Kelly Williquette of 379 Rimrock Drive, being in favor of the request, stated that nothing has really changed since his request for water outside of City Limits on July 14, 2025, and that droughts happen yearly. There were no additional testimony being in favor. There was no testimony being neutral or in opposition. There were no additional comments. The public hearing was closed at 6:06 p.m.

Following deliberation, there was a motion to approve the request for applicant to receive City water services for property located at 550 and 562 Rimrock Drive, St. Maries, Idaho 83861, based on these lots already being accounted for in the facility plan.

Druffel stated that his request is the same as the previous public hearing request . There were no questions for staff or applicant by Councilors at this time. The public hearing was open at 6:12 p.m.. There were no written comments. There was no testimony being in favor, neutral, or in opposition. There were no additional comments. The public hearing was closed at 6:13 p.m.

Following deliberation, there was a motion to approve the request for applicant to receive City water services for property located at 347 Rimrock Drive, St. Maries, Idaho 83861, based on these lots already being accounted for in the facility plan.

7. Reports and Communications

a. Mayor's Update.

Mayor Carver showed the Council a video of the Rochet Creek cavitating due to low water levels. Carver also shared some rough calculations for the cost to run the wells and stated it would be about \$17,724.96 per month.

b. City Council Comments.

Councilor Dorendorf stated that he would suggest those that are running for city office to show up to meetings and show interest.

Councilor Powell stated she has spoken with a candidate running for city office and shared that it is a learning process and it is good to communicate between council members.

Councilor Ryan stated that at the previous meeting he mentioned a residence outside of city limits being on an upcoming agenda for consideration of water services, however, due to consistency, those who may want to be reconsidered for water outside of city limits should reach out to City Hall to keep the process consistent.

Councilor Ryan also mentioned he understands Councilor Tina Thomson is running for Mayor and that she is a current Benewah County employee. Ryan expressed concerns about Benewah County and the City having various areas of collaboration and that he believes it is not a benefit to city residents to have a county employee representing those collaborative topics with the county. Ryan comments on how can a city taxpayer expect to have their interest properly represented when the person that represents them is an employee of Benewah County as he believes it is a conflict of interest. Ryan continued that Thomson stated the current administration is "working to destroy our community", and while he hasn't agreed with everything Mayor Carver has done, Carver is continuously improving the city. Ryan questioned whether Thomson would be planning

on resigning if elected as Mayor so the taxpayers can be represented and not have to worry about the person representing them having a conflict for being on each side.

City Attorney, Fonda Jovick, stated that there would be procedures in place for any potential conflicts of interest that may arise.

Councilor Spooner stated that it is wise for all candidates to come in and get familiar with the process.

c. Public Works Director's Update.

Shiloh Pfeiffer, Public Works Director, stated he discussed with Idaho Rural Water Association about setting up text alerts for operators, and will continue to research that option.

d. Police Update.

e. Building Official Update.

Jacob Parsons, Building Official, stated that the approval for the HUD housing program is still under review by DOPL. Parsons also stated that the State is currently looking into the adoption of the 2024 building code.

Mayor Carver recited the rules and procedures for public comment, followed by an opportunity for comments from the public regarding items included on the agenda and other topics relevant to the business of the City of St. Maries. Information only; no Council action.

There were no public comments.
