

Katie's Roar is Collecting Gifts for their Annual Christmas Toy Drive for the Ronald McDonald House

The most wonderful time of the year is on our doorstep, but for many, especially those who have suffered the loss of a child, the season is not as merry and bright as it once was.

"The absolute worst thing a parent can experience is the death of a child, and the holidays are tough because there is always that empty chair and the stocking with their name that never gets filled again," Lisa Bjorn-dahl shared. "To be honest, every day is hard when you lose a child, but the holidays are just heartbreaking, and there are many silent tears that roll down our cheeks as we try to make the best holiday we can for those still with us, but the emptiness in our hearts is gut-wrenching at times."

Following the loss of their daughter, Katie, who passed away in 2018, the Bjorndahls founded Katie's Roar, a nonprofit dedicated to honoring Katie's memory through acts of kindness and promoting mental

health awareness. In September of 2023, Katie's Roar became involved

with the Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) of the Red River

Valley by sponsoring a room, providing supplies, and cooking meals for the families residing there. Knowing how challenging the holiday season can be, Katie's Roar has made it part of their mission to spread a little joy through the Katie's Roar Toy Drive that ensures families staying at the RMHC have a Merry Christmas.

Thanks to the community's help, Katie's Roar Christmas Toy Drive has become an annual tradition that has lifted more spirits than donors will ever know. Those parents who are sitting beside a hospital bed trying to comfort their sick child, barely have the energy to accomplish everyday tasks, let alone the energy to pull the holidays together for the rest of their family. The very idea of purchasing Christmas presents while living out of a suitcase at the RMHC is a burden many of you have taken off their shoulders, and a blessing you have gifted their children in the past.

The RMHC is founded on "Keep- ing families together and providing the comforts of home while their kids

receive medical care." The nonprofit, grounded "in heart, creativity, adapt- ability, and teamwork," first opened its doors in Philadelphia, Pennsylva- nia, in 1974. The first Fargo RMHC opened at 1234 North Broadway in 1982, and a second location in South Fargo in 2005.

In May 2018, RMHC of the Red River Valley found a new, larger home at 4757 Agassiz Crossing to replace the two smaller houses. The RMHC becomes home to many families who find themselves in heart-breaking, difficult situations that no parent ever wants to face.

"Families that stay at the RMHC have a child who is in critical care at the hospital, including the psychiatric hospital, or they may be staying there while their child is receiving cancer treatments, or with a preemie baby that needs to be close to the hospital.

The house is full of families staying there, and so there is a great need to help," Lisa explained.

Last year, Katie's Roar included in memory of Cole Carlson, who passed away on Katie's birthday in their annual toy drive. Cole is the son of Karen Kasin, who is both a dear friend of Lisa and had a hand in founding Katie's Roar.

"We got the call about his tragic accident while we were actually volunteering at the RMHC, making a meal for the families in honor of Katie's birthday. We finished up quickly and rushed right to Karen's home with another one of our best friends. It has been just shocking and so sad that both Karen and I, who have been long time best friends, both lost a child," Lisa shared.

"Cole was a very giving and gener- ous person, who could light up a room with either a joke or a goofy smile on his face. Cole and Katie loved to laugh, lived life to the fullest, and

were two of the most compassionate and loving people. Karen and I are extremely proud of those kids! They both loved the holidays as kids, so it was only natural that the annual toy drive be in their memory. It is something that Karen and I do together to honor our beautiful and much loved kids.”

Katie’s Roar Christmas Toy Drive continues to gain momentum each

season and has become a part of our community’s holiday tradition. With a community like Hawley full of warm and generous folks, who needs elves?

“Last year’s toy drive doubled from the year before. We filled up two large SUVs and made our delivery. With the monies donated, we purchased numerous gas cards and items off their Amazon wish list,” Lisa commented.

“Our community, schools, businesses, and local organizations are just amazing and have always been so supportive in Katie’s Roar’s mission. It is very heartwarming to see everyone come together. I am just so overwhelmed with emotions by the love, kindness, and generosity that the Hawley community has always shown. I am so proud to call Hawley my home,” Lisa said. “This annual tradition means the world to us because there is no better feeling than to take a tragedy like our families have experienced and that the community has experienced and make something positive arise from it. I know Katie and Cole are extremely proud of everyone coming together to help those less fortunate because that is the kind of people they were.”
