

RE: 2024 Christmas Program & Costume Requirements

Mark your calendars...our Christmas program is fast approaching! The program will be December 11th (Wednesday) and December 12th (Thursday) at 7:00 p.m. in the gym. All 1st-6th graders should wear Christmas party attire (no jeans) for ACT I and costumes for ACT II (parents can assist their child with costumes during intermission). IMPORTANT: 1st-6th graders will need a small working flashlight (with their names on it). All PK3-K students will be in ACT I ONLY and may be retrieved by their parents during intermission (NOT BEFORE). All students should report to their classrooms no later than 6:40 p.m. Students will be called to the Fine Arts building at 6:50 p.m. to line up backstage for the show. The Christmas program is MANDATORY (as stated in the SJS Handbook) and will be your child's Music grade for the quarter. STUDENTS MUST PERFORM WITH THEIR CLASS ON THEIR SCHEDULED PERFORMANCE DAY (no swaps will be considered). Any questions? Contact: tevans@stjamesgulfport.com. COSTUME REQUIREMENTS - continued



- PK3 Will be Santa's Elves. Traditional red & green colors with pointy ears and rosy cheeks
- PK4 Will be Santa's Toys. Dolls, superheroes, teddy bears etc. (must look like a toy)
 - K Will be in their Christmas pajamas. Christmas themed nightgowns or tops and pants. Slipper socks or slippers that stay on their feet work best
 - 1- Will be Reindeer. Must have antlers that stay on their head during dance and a black dot on the tip of their nose
 - 2 Will be Polar Express Waiters. Need long sleeved white shirt and black pants or black skirts w/black tights, black socks and black shoes. Need a white kitchen towel tucked at the waist on front of pants.
 - 3 Will be Candy Cane Land people. Need to wear red and white only. Must see both colors.



- 4 Will be 1940's Swing dancers. Boys need a vest or sweater that is Christmas themed. Girls need to wear a Christmas tree skirt (turned into a skirt) for the bottom and a Christmas themed top plus a Christmas poinsettia attached to one side of their hair
- 5 Will be the Blues Brothers. Must wear a blue top and blue long pants (any shade of blue), blue vest (optional), black shoes, white COTTON (not nylon) socks, black sunglasses and a black or blue Fedora hat. NO dresses or skirts
- 6 Will be Glow in the Dark. Need to be in black from top to bottom (including black shoes and socks). Need a black beanie cap to put their hair under. Apply designs directly to the black top and bottom with orange and pink neon duct tape





Each PK3 - 6th grade student paints only ONE ornament.

Be on time for school!



Being on time for school is very important. The bell rings at 8:00 a.m., and the school day begins at that time. Prayer and Pledge are said, and important announcements are made pertaining to the day and to upcoming events.

Even before the 8:00 a.m. bell rings, students do bellwork in their classrooms. Teachers are collecting items from students that will be sent to the office after the announcements are made. They take attendance and enter the lunch preferences and counts. If it is a Mass day, they are preparing to go to the Church. If they have a Special Class, they are moving from their homeroom class to Spanish, Computer, P.E., Library, Music, or Art. Morning time is a busy time and a vital part of the day for all students from PreK-2 through 6th grade. Tardiness disrupts the classroom routine and instructional time, no matter the grade.

We understand that emergencies and extenuating circumstances occur. Please alert the office when these situations arise. Otherwise, please arrive on time.

According to the tardy policy on page 5 of the SJCS Handbook, when a student accumulates 5 tardies in a semester, a letter will be sent or a mandatory meeting will be held with school administration.

Remember, don't be late; you'll miss something great!





Missing a day of school here and there may not seem like much, but it adds up!

When a student misses 2 days a month:

- They will miss 20 days a year
- They will miss 30 hours of math over the school year
- They will miss 60 hours of reading and writing over the school year
- They will miss over a year of school by graduation

When a student misses 4 days a month:

- They will miss 40 days a year
- They will miss 60 hours of math over the school year
- They will miss 120 hours of reading and writing over the school year
- They will miss over 2 years of school by graduation
