ABCA Updates:

- Street signage proposal — HOA agreed to install street signs at the following locations (Park Run/Newland, Park Run/Sky Vista Way, Capri Way/Hollygate, Sky Vista/Village Green Way (right turn). Waiting for installation. We will review north side once completed.
- Speed limit proposal — HOA approved our proposal for a 20mph speed limit within the community—waiting for sign installation.
- Additional options to reduce speeding in the community are being researched.
- Gate—options for alternative gate monitoring are being researched.
- CPR Training will be offered in January—stay tuned!

SCAMMERS....New bank scam! Scammers will call using a caller ID of your bank's name. They say they are from the fraud department and give you the last 4 correct digits of your debit card. They say there is suspicious activity and need your pin to deactivate your card and send you a new one—don't be fooled! To verify always call the bank on the back of your card.

Slow down.....for the safety of all residents please slow down! Altis HOA approved a 20 mph speed limit in the community.

Did you know.....

Signs of a stroke—remember the acronym “BEFAST ” **B=Balance difficulties, E = Eyesight changes, F=face drooping** especially on one side, **A=arm weakness, S=speech difficulty, T=time** is of the essence; **call 911** to seek immediate medical assistance. Symptoms can also include numbness in face or extremities, trouble understanding speech, dizziness or loss of balance/coordination, and headache.
