In doing this, I don't want to add anything tedious or extra to your workload, because I know that we're already very busy! Rather than having a nomination and selection every single week, Mr. Olds had the idea of having each content select a "Student of the Week" in a 4 (or 5 if we include electives) cycle. That way, just once a month in your PLC you can discuss a boy and a girl who deserve to be our "RTH 6th Graders of the week".

As far as a reward goes, I will talk to Admin about giving our student of the weeks a SWAG pass on Friday, and a cut in line card for lunch. Please share if you have any other rewards that you think would be good!

Ideally, I would like to begin this on the week of September 30th, and carry on throughout the rest of the school year. I'll try to check in with each of you in the next few days to make sure you are on board, and then we'll set up the logistics of choosing the students!
