wanted to take a

different approach. We really wanted the kids to get into the farming aspect. The day to day, to bring things full circle, and to learn that the consumers are a pivotal piece of what we do. We won't lie though, the weather was brutal! The heat of the week did not disappoint and these kids had to learn how being a farmer meant the work still needed to be done, even though we didn't feel like it.

Throughout the week we have had 12 little farmers join us, and they accomplished many different farm tasks. Many of you may have noticed that packing was not the same throughout the week, or maybe you saw the little thank you card the kids decorated for you. What we did throughout the week, the kids enjoyed and they were so excited to be a part of the bags and the farmer's market throughout the week. The kids were proud of what they did and what they learned.

At the end of the week, as we were talking to the kids, we asked them if they had any questions and one kiddo said, "When do we get paid for what we did?" This led into a great way to close out our week and explain one of the hardest parts of farming. We explained how farmers might not get paid for their work. In fact here on this farm, we don't get paid for our work and we each work away from the farm in order to continue to farm. Farmers more work to feed the world. They are passionate about growing food for people in the community and how to get them a healthy option. The kids were surprised that many farmers do not get "paid" for their work. They took that learning time and asked more questions about the other kinds of farming and moving forward in the things that we do. Each day might be crazy here on the farm, but taking the time to spend a week with the kids was a blast and created a chance to teach the kids the who, what, where, and why we keep going no matter what the challenge it.

July flew by, but it allowed us to finish up our first crop of hay. The weather was hot and the hay was down the road so it was a lot of traveling with equipment up and down a short stretch of the road, however no matter what, these travels never disappoint with people who are in a hurry. I will say it till I am no longer farming, stop breaking traffic laws to get around farm equipment and be safe always. Our biggest contender when moving equipment is people passing on double yellow lines, and poor vision. Most people are patient, but it will only take one person to make a poor decision and our family as well as their family could be paying the price. We want people to be safe, and we know the tractors and equipment go slower, but remember that is our sons, husbands, fathers, mothers, wives in those tractors and following a tractor for three miles on avg only adds 6 extra minutes. Those 6 minutes could keep you,



your family, our family, and other families safe. So let's remember rural road safety and stay behind the tractor unless in a passing zone and have good lines of sight.

If you ask us, growing produce is one of the BIGGEST gambles a farmer can make. There is no crop insurance policy for the loss of a crop, there is no guarantee a seed will germinate, and even if it does germinate then here comes the hungry creatures ready to eat it. It just has the least amount of guarantee you will see a harvest. However, let's talk Bulk ordering. Growing up, my grandparents had a notebook that sat in the road side tent and we took orders for people who wanted items. Many people want us to go back to that however, when we created the Subscription program, the model of our farm changed.

So what does that mean for you? Well it is harder to take those orders, because our philosophy is, that if we take that order, then we are obligated to fill it. Well, we also provide the subscription

program, so filling those orders because a constant source of stress. What if we don't have the green beans for the subscribers, plus all these orders? What if the peppers don't grow but here is three more orders? It's just so hard to figure out what to do, so last week maybe you saw we had some bushel items, we have decided advertising or word of mouth, or a simple request is how we will take it. We need to ensure that those who subscribe are getting their items first and then we can move forward with bulk after that. Either way, we are happy to provide items to many people's home and we hope that you will continue not to bulk about our new farm model to sell our products.
