November 15 at Gresham Park to Kickoff the Project and Empower Young Athletes On and Off the Field*

Atlanta, GA – November 14, 2025 — The **Roots to Home Project**, a mission-driven baseball initiative founded by professional athletes **Ivan Johnson** and **Rece Hinds**, will host its inaugural **Roots to Home Baseball Clinics** tomorrow **Saturday, November 15, 2025**, at **Gresham Park** in Atlanta, Georgia.

The one-day event – **November 15 at Gresham Park** -- will feature two specialized sessions:

Dedicated to giving back to the communities that raised them, Johnson and Hinds created Roots to Home to provide free, high-quality baseball instruction along with life skills coaching, mentorship, and college preparation for young athletes—particularly those from underserved areas. The program’s goal is to equip participants with tools for success both on the field and beyond the diamond. Each clinic will include professional-level baseball training in hitting, fielding, base running, and baseball IQ, as well as mentorship and guidance on character development, teamwork, and preparation for higher levels of play.
