*Swap meets all across the country have been in a decline for several years now so KYSWAP decided to take a detailed look at our business operation. The focus this year has been on liability issues, labor scheduling, and advertising. Neil White has done a great job of negotiating our advertising contract so that it reaches a wider geographical area. Our belief is that combining more advertising with the new swap meet web page ([www.kyanaswapmeet.com](http://www.kyanaswapmeet.com)) will result in more walk in door receipts. There are several factors that affect attendance. The volleyball tournament, college basketball games and the weather. We've put in a request for cold weather for the weekend so people won't be doing outside activities and instead attend a nice heated indoor swap meet.*

*If you remember the old Kyana Swap Meet trailer, it has been sold. Our trailer was a 1996 model that needed a minimum of \$2200 in repairs to bring it up to the condition that it could pass a DOT inspection. The most important issue is that in Kentucky, corporations are required to title, license, and insure trailers and since we don't have a title we couldn't license it. We can't insure a trailer unless we own the vehicle that tows it so owning a trailer a big liability risk. Also, we are in the process of replacing our sign stands with new versatile light weight units that use easily replaceable corrugated type plastic sign material. This gives us flexibility with our signage for each particular event.*

*Jane Burke has done a great job as our Sidelight editor for the last two years but she is retiring to focus her time on other interests. Thank you Jane for your hard work. Fortunately, Dean Smith has volunteered to take on the Sidelight responsibilities. In addition to being in law enforcement, Dean has extensive experience with graphic design and publishing. We are almost out of feature articles so we need some members to send some articles in the next couple of months. If you don't, we're going to send Dean out to arrest you on charges of "Failure to Write Away."*

## *Don Sisco's 1950 Chevy deluxe two door styleline sedan*

The first owner of this car purchased it brand new right off the showroom floor for \$925. However, that price included many options. The options included a spotlight with rearview mirror on the back, a deluxe pushbutton radio, sunvisor over the windshield, front and rear bumperettes and bumper guard, chrome wheel trim rings, deluxe hood ornament, traffic light finder on the dash, a glass windshield washer fluid reservoir and finally, fender skirts.

In 1989 the car was awarded the AACA national first place trophy. That award is still attached to the cars front bumper along with the cars original inspection sticker that is still affixed to the windshield.

After owning this car for 47 years the first owner sold it to the second owner who kept the car another 19 years. At that time the car was sold to the classic car company (an automobile broker) in Kansas.

Don purchased the car from them in November 2016. Don is a neighbor of mine. I usually see him going in and out of our subdivision all the time in one of his antique cars. Don has only had his Chevy out on the road a few times since purchasing it. However, Don has told me it runs like a scalded dog! This car is totally original inside and out but it looks restored.

After 68 years I think it could still sit on a show room floor and pass for new. I hope someday Don and Carol will be able to drive it over to our clubhouse for all of us to see. I have had the good fortune to look it over several times and to me it's a real piece of General Motors history.

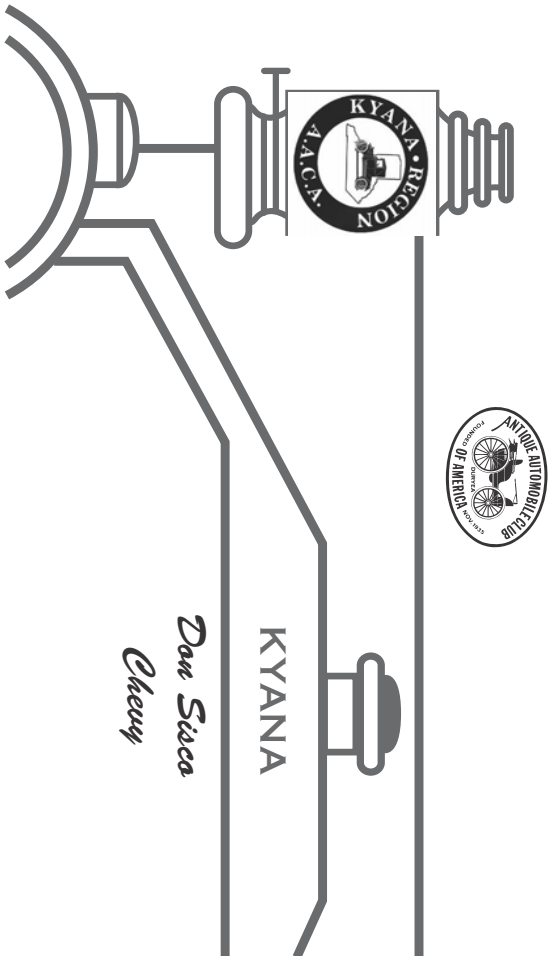
