If things work out, maybe we'll do it again next year.

One thing to always keep in mind. Whatever we do let's have fun with the old car hobby. I hope to see you on the road or maybe at a swap meet.

Meeting called to order @ 6:39 p.m.

Secretary's Report: Chester motioned to accept the June report. Pat seconded the motion and the report was accepted with all in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Mark made a motion to accept the June report. Chester seconded the motion and the motion carried with all in favor.

Activities: Alex Wilkins is sponsoring KYANA's participation in the Lanesville parade on September 14. The KYANA board picnic will be held on September 22 at the clubhouse.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

We have many members that due to age and/or health issues cannot work the swap meet. We continue to need more workers at the swap meet and for the last several years have supplemented KYANA's own workers with a variety of volunteer groups. There are also many potential members that want to join KYANA but cannot due to the current membership cap. Eliminating the cap will help solve both issues.

The original reasoning for the cap was to allow the clubhouse to safely and efficiently accommodate a maximum number of members at our four big dinner meetings each year: January Business Meeting, Swap Meet Planning Meeting, annual picnic, and Awards and Elections. Despite the membership cap being raised several times over the years, we have yet to fill the clubhouse to capacity. Following several months of discussion on this topic, the Board moved at its April meeting to amend the current bylaws to remove the membership cap. The current KYANA bylaws, Article III, Section 3f states: "all applications of pre-members are to be approved by the board of directors, and a membership limit of 275 persons will be adopted."

The proposed change to Article III, section 3f reads: "all applications of pre-members are to be approved by the board of directors."

Following the required number of notifications, a vote of the full membership on the proposed bylaw change will take place at an upcoming general meeting. The Board welcomes your comments, questions, and feedback regarding this proposed bylaw change.

KYANA at Bowman Field October 4th, 5th, 6th

Cars will participate on October 5th and 6th. Friday, October 4th is mainly for veterans, and they will be taking them on plane flights, etc. that day. Saturday and Sunday will have cars and planes on display. Lots of improvements are being made from last year. Parking will be moved from Taylorsville Road and will now be on Dutchmans Lane (by the DMV), with separate access for older cars which will be displayed. Again, we will be matching cars with planes, and there will be a separate area (probably on or near one of the runways) for other cars to be displayed. Like last year, there will probably be a couple car clubs represented and I will try to get an area reserved for KYANA members. I'm working on getting a tent, layout details, where the cars can be parked overnight on Saturday, and of course, the food details (I know that's priority number one with this group). There will be a 5K on Saturday morning, which will take place on the airport grounds (should be a neat venue). A pancake breakfast will follow and they will make sure they can accommodate a large group. Food trucks will be there on Saturday and Sunday, as well as other vendors. There will be music both days, and there will be an air show on Saturday that should be a big draw.

KENTUCKY WAGON MANUFACTURING COMPANY

The <u>DIXIE FLYER</u>, a Louisville built automobile By Steve Lippmann

Well, KYANA club members, other than Fords, there was another automobile manufactured in Louisville, Kentucky. Yes, the Kentucky Wagon Manufacturing Company built cars here in our town. Production was between 1912 and 1923. The company was originally founded in 1878 before automobiles were realistically being considered. At the turn-of-the-century this company began to diversify in order to enter the automotive field and in 1912 acquired another firm called The Electric Vehicle Company. They planned and designed an automotive model called the Kentucky Electric, but it was never produced. Nevertheless, between 1912-1916 they made a truck named The Urban Electric. During those years, they acquired a New Albany, Indiana firm: The Hercules Motor Car Company.

The Kentucky Wagon Manufacturing Company next introduced the DIXIE FLYER car in 1916. It was a gasoline-powered vehicle with a four-cylinder engine manufactured by and purchased from either Lycoming or Herschel/Spillman. The Dixie Flyer was advertised as, a "logical" car and the windshield was incorporated into a curved cowl dash and came with a spring-mounted radiator. Years later, in 1922 they introduce a more "sporty" model, the Firefly Speedster.

There was a recession following World War I. Thus, in the following years of 1922-1923, the Kentucky Wagon Manufacturing Company went bankrupt. They then merged with several other businesses into Associated Motor Industries out of Dayton, Ohio, who utilized standardized production of cars, trucks, and automotive parts. That acquisition meant that all Dixie automobiles that had already been produced were rebranded as Nationals. This process was accomplished simply by changing the radiator name plate and replacing the hubcaps with the National brand. This company was renamed the National Motors Corporation, but it ceased production within two years. There were no further Dixie Flyers nor Firefly Speeders made in Louisville or anywhere else.

Then into 2010, a restored Dixie Flyer was sent from Australia to Louisville to the Kentucky Trailer Company, now called the Kentucky Manufacturing Company (they build large trailers). The return to Louisville was reported in a 2010 Courier-Journal story by Deborah Yetter.

The car is usually on display in a special temperature-controlled showroom at 2601 South Third Street. In recent months, this Louisville-made car was on temporary loan for public showing about Kentucky transportation history at the Corvette Museum in Bowling Green. It is set to return here this summer, 2018. Anyone wishing to see the Dixie Flyer should first call Kentucky Trailer Company at 502-637-2551 for a tour of this automobile.
