From the President Fred Trusty

The contract with Horseshoe Casino & Hotel as the venue for the AACA 2020 Southeastern Fall Nationals hosted by KYANA was signed in 2018. Several months after the contract was signed the parent company, Caesars Entertainment, announced that since Indiana changed their gaming law, the old floating casino on the river would be removed and a new land based casino would be built and renamed Caesars Casino & Hotel. The grand opening of the new Caesars Casino was December 13, 2019.

Under the original Horseshoe Casino/Hotel floor plan, everyone including those under the age of 21 had access to all of the meeting rooms and the banquet room. Under the new Caesars Casino/Hotel floor plan the meeting rooms and banquet room are part of the casino area. Under Indiana law, no one under the age of 21 is permitted in the casino area so any AACA members that are under 21 would not be able to attend any meetings or dinners including the judges breakfast.

It is unacceptable to exclude AACA members or their families under the age of 21 from any of the dinners or activities. Written notice was sent to Caesars on Tuesday, January 20, 2020 informing them we are cancelling the contract per the force majeure clause.

The week of January 20th I met with the Corydon, Indiana Visitors Center representative, the Facilities Manager of the Harrison County Fairgrounds, and met with the sales representatives of 4 motels in Corydon. There are a total of 339 rooms in Corydon plus more hotels that could be utilized in Georgetown, New Albany, and Caesars. The Harrison County Fairgrounds has plenty of room for trailer parking and a large air conditioned event building with a seating capacity of 800. If you would like to volunteer to be chairman of the banquet facility setup and cleanup committee, please contact me. This is a big job that will require at least a half dozen people. The show field will be the grass infield of the ½ mile harness track. The Comfort Inn (under complete renovation and rebranding as a Clarion Point Hotel) will be the host hotel and used for the Round Table Forum and Judging School. As of the writing of this article the contracts with the Harrison County Fairgrounds and the 4 Corydon motels have been signed, and the Thursday bus tour is in place. More information to come soon.

I just returned from the AACA Annual Convention in Philadelphia. The renovation of newly acquired headquarter and library building is under way and hopefully will open before Hershey week this year. With the acquisition of the Philadelphia Free Public Library's automotive collection, the AACA Library will be by far the largest automotive literature collection in the world. As an AACA member you get an hour and a half of free research per year including online research. This is a 12-million-dollar project and we are less than 2 million dollars from completing the fundraising but we seem to have hit a plateau. An anonymous member at the convention offered to match any donations and pledges made during the weekend up to \$250,000. When I left the hotel on Sunday, we had already raised over \$110,000. If every AACA member donated just \$33, the building would be paid for.

The swap meet is the engine that drives our organization so thanks to everyone that makes the swap meet a success. If you see a couple of '55 Pontiac station wagon tail lights let me know.

KYANA Salvage Yard Tour – March 21

Mark your calendar for March 21 when the salvage yard tour returns to the KYANA activity list. This year we will make a return visit to a yard south of Bardstown that we visited many years ago. The yard has grown since our last visit, adding more vintage cars and trucks to their already large inventory.



Rob Johnson and I made a scouting run in late December and confirmed that this yard should keep most KYANA members busy for at least a couple hours. The yard operator is very accommodating and is looking forward to our visit in late March.

Most salvage yards in early spring can be very muddy, messy places, and although this yard is in better shape than most, you will still need to be prepared. Please plan accordingly, dress in old clothes and wear boots or other footwear you do not mind

getting muddy and dirty. If you plan to remove some needed parts, please bring your own tools. There is limited parking at the yard itself so it would help to keep the cars in the caravan to a minimum. Please carpool with your fellow Club members, if possible, and leave your car in one of the parking lots close to our morning meeting location.

After we have worked up an appetite at the salvage yard, we will return north to Bardstown where we will dine at Kurtz's Restaurant. We will dine as a group in a separate room and select from four different hearty lunch specials including Kentucky Hot Brown, Fried Country Ham, Chopped Sirloin with Onion Gravy, or Grilled Chicken Parmesan on Angel Hair Pasta. All selections include salad, bread, soft drink, and dessert.

If you plan to dine at Kurtz's, cost per KYANA member is only \$10.00. Cost for non-members is \$22.50 including tax and gratuity. Non-members pay at the restaurant. We typically have several non-members attend this event so please extend the welcome to your car buddies that are not yet KYANA members.



There is no cost to attend if you decide not to eat with the group, however, if you plan to attend this tour and will not be eating with the group and therefore not sending a check, please extend the courtesy of notifying me that you plan to attend. This will allow me to know how many members and guests to expect at the salvage yard.

On Saturday morning, March 21, we will meet at 8:30 a.m. in the Chick-Fil-A at 7901 Bardstown Rd, Louisville, KY 40291, just south of the Gene Snyder Freeway at the intersection of Brentlinger Lane.

There is plenty of parking in the adjacent Kohl's parking lot. We will depart for the salvage yard at 9:00 a.m. going south on Bardstown Rd., Route 31E all the way to Bardstown. We will make a quick comfort stop at the Bardstown McDonalds at the intersection of US 150 and KY 49, then continue on to the destination.

Please note: KYANA's salvage yard tours take place rain or shine! There is no rain date, and since we must commit to Kurtz's Restaurant in advance, NO REFUNDS will be granted if your plans change after March 15. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding.

WHY ONLY IN OCTOBER?

Why is the month of October the only month out of the entire year that we can take applications for folks to become pre-members and join our Club? If you think I'm kidding, check it out for yourself. Look in the back of your membership roster under membership, Article III, Section 3. I can't figure out what purpose this by-law could possibly have. In my opinion this by-law tends to hinder new membership. For example, say you have a good friend or relative that owns and enjoys antique cars (or for that matter any car type) and wants to join our club. Now let's say it's the middle of February, you will have to tell him/her that he/she has to wait eight months just to file an application to become a pre-member then he/she has to wait another 12 months until October rolls around again to become a regular club member. Things like this tend to discourage many fine folks who might have become new friends and members of our club. Please don't misunderstand me, I am not saying we need to make any changes in our by-laws concerning pre-members during their first year as candidates to join our club, they will still need a sponsor and they will still need to attend six events including working at our KYANA Swap Meet for at least one four hour shift. Our club needs all the active members we can get and that by-law helps us to achieve our goal. Some of you are probably saying to yourself that we already have around 260 – 270 members, so why do we need more? This is very true, but let me ask you something, how many of those members are still active?

KYANA has been around for decades and decades so it's an old club and we have a lot of older members. As folks get older, they become less active, we develop disabilities and may have medical problems. Three of our club's biggest events are the Awards & Elections, the Christmas Dinner, the Appreciation Dinner, and our picnic. We usually have between 120 and 135 members attend these events. So where is the other half of our members? They simply are just not active anymore. These folks are still our friends and over the past years they have helped to make our club what it is today. However, this doesn't help our KYANA Swap Meet situation. I'm sure all of you know the \$10.00 per year dues we pay doesn't go far when it comes to running a club the size of ours. The Swap Meet is our club's bread and butter. It's the reason we have our Club House and the grounds it sits on. It's also the reason our members get such great deals on the events we have like the dinners we have at the country clubs and the catered meals we all enjoy at our Club House; as well as the discount we get on shirts and jackets. Our club is also able to donate to several charities who help folks in our community that are not as fortunate as we are (especially little children who would get nothing for Christmas if it were not for us). I must say that all of us are part of one great organization we can all take pride in.

Over the past 50+ years the Swap Meet has grown, but the number of active club members to work the Swap Meet has declined. We are now hiring outside help that digs deep into our profits especially when this help often does not have the same interest and dedication as we have in monitoring admittance. When they don't take their jobs seriously many people are able to sneak into our Swap Meet without paying. This eats even further into our profits. So, I guess what I'm trying to say is that we need more active members and to do that we need to make it a little easier for folks to become members. Changing that one month only to accept pre-members would go a long way to help our club, and I can't see that the change would do any harm. It would mean a lot more work for our membership chairman, who right now is only working during the month of October. I say, let's start accepting pre-members all year long and put that lazy membership chairman (me) back to work. He'll get over it...LOL...

Please give some thought to what I've talked about and feel free to call me with any ideas you might have. Maybe we can bring this up at a meeting in a few months and everyone can weigh in on it then. THANKS.
