It is easiest to start with a digital photo file, but we can also work with an existing print or negative. The prices cover the cost of the printing services, which are subject to change:

- Digital photo file \$43
- Photo negative \$48
- Existing print up to 5" x 7"- \$53
- Existing print up to 12" x 18" \$77

In 2002, Jeff Lane established Lane Motor Museum. Jeff has been an automotive enthusiast since an early age. He began restoring his first car—a 1955 MG TF—when he was a teen. His personal collection was the donation that began the foundation. Lane Motor Museum unveiled its collection to the public in October of 2003. As director, Jeff Lane continues to search out cars for the collection that are technically significant or uniquely different. The goal of Lane Motor Museum is to share in the mission of collection and preserving automotive history for future generations.

Lane Motor Museum is one of the few museums in the U.S. to specialize in European cars. It is a working museum with the goal of maintaining all vehicles in running order. Some cars are in showroom condition, while others represent typical aging. Efforts are made to restore each vehicle to near-original specifications.

The Museum has been developed in a well-known Nashville landmark, the former Sunbeam Bakery at 702 Murfreesboro Pike. Home to the bread company beginning in 1951, the



132,000 square-foot facility was the largest and most modern bakery in the area at the time of its opening. The bakery building, outfitted for the museum's needs but left with many of its original characteristics, has a high ceiling, natural light, and hand-crafted brick and maple wood flooring. The architectural style complements the age of the cars represented. The main floor has approximately 40,000 square feet of open space, ideal for displaying the collection.

Lane Motor Museum is excited to offer Vehicle Demonstrations and guided Vault Tours on the **weekends**!

Vault Tours are held on *most* **Saturdays** and **Sundays** at 11:30 am and again at 2:00 pm. Vault tour schedules may change weekly so please check the schedule below to verify

that a Vault Tour is scheduled for the specific day you wish to visit. Tours are currently offered on **weekends only**. Only guided tours of the vault area are available so guests are not able to visit the vault unattended.

Although the museum has over 580 cars and motorcycles in our collection, we only have space to display about 150 cars at any given time. This tour is approximately 45 minutes long and gives an opportunity to view many of the other cars in our collection that are stored downstairs. Groups for vault tours will gather inside the museum exhibit area, near the brochure display. Tours will begin promptly at their scheduled time so please arrive about 5 minutes before the start time. Guests are asked to stay inside the yellow lines at all times because there are many slippery spots from oil and grease spills so it is dangerous to walk between the cars. Photography is allowed.



To access the vault from the main exhibit level, you will have to travel down a long, steep flight of stairs. If you are unable to use the stairs, please let a member of the museum staff know and we can help make arrangements to meet you at the back door of the vault. You will have to drive or walk to the back of the building to access this door.



Come join Carol and me as we lead you on an adventure to visit the Lane Motor Museum on Friday, September 16 and Saturday, September 17, 2022. We will be leaving Louisville on Friday afternoon for the short three hour trip down I-65 to Nashville Tennessee.



Enjoy a Dinner show At the Nashville Nightlife Dinner Theatre. Eat a delicious buffet dinner then experience a celebration of Country Music from both past



and present. Hear songs from many of the great artists in country music history along with today's hottest superstars. Enjoy the music of everyone from Hank Williams Sr. and Patsy Cline to the superstars of today like Sara Evans and Toby Keith! Throughout the season we have many guest stars appear at our theater including: (Grand Ole Opry Star) Jeannie Seely, "The Fiddle Man" Tim Watson, "Rising Star" Zach Janson, Diana Murrell, "Nashville's favorite" Brenda Best, Paula Poe Murrell (from the Tammy Wynette show) and many other celebrities.
