Because We Care

As everyone knows this year Mother Nature has not been kind to the state of Kentucky, whether it be Western Kentucky with tornados or Eastern Kentucky with 100-year flooding. The fact that all of our neighbors and friends in these areas have been totally wiped out of their homes, schools, businesses and their normal everyday lives is devastating. These people are our neighbors, friends and relatives that have no place to go and live their normal lives. To think about all of the devastation, the lives lost and the sheer chaos that exists in their lives today cannot be described.

As you all know we have a lot of caring people in our car club, and we always try to do good. So, this past summer when we were working the NSRA Swap Meet one of our members, Jamie Garey, had an idea and it soon started resonating among all the members working the Swap Meet. His idea was a wonderful thought. The more we talked about it the more we wanted to do it. We all met and decided to present this to the board of directors of KYANA Charities. The idea was to donate all the money we made at the NSRA Swap Meet this year to a flooded area in Eastern Kentucky. To us, this seemed like the right thing to do. So, five of us attended the KYANA Charity Board meeting to present our idea. Hunt Palmer-Ball was the spokesman along with Jamie Garey, Charlie Myers, Ed Ferguson and Donnie Meyers. After the presentation we left the meeting so the Board could discuss our request. We all went outside to discuss what we would plan on doing. It wasn't long before the Board approved the idea. The guys were thrilled that the board reached consensus quickly, because this was going to be a timely event and we needed to make plans before winter sets in. Not only did the board approve our proposal, they added an additional ~\$5,000 to bring the total donation to \$14,000!

We finally decided to take a fact-finding mission trip. Neil White called around and ended up speaking to a lady named Wanda Brown at the Fiscal Court House in Hazard, Kentucky. She was very accommodating and helped us determine the areas with the most need and the people in charge of the disaster recovery for surrounding counties. So, on Wednesday, October 5th, Jamie, Hunt and Neil headed to Hazard, Kentucky. Our meeting was at 1:00 PM with the county judge and Wanda Brown. We received a wealth of information from that meeting. That led us to another meeting with Scott McReynolds, Director of Housing Development and Recovery. Scott was amazed and thankful that we took our time to come all the way to Hazard from Louisville to see for ourselves the destruction of his community. Scott and his staff helped us very much and explained everything that was going on and where the help was needed. He took us to view the new subdivision site for displaced families and showed us all the good work being done. After spending a half hour or so with Scott, we felt we had all the information we needed to help us with our decision. This trip did exactly what we needed, but I really think that when Scott told us that in his town alone, they lost 1900 homes, which did not include the other destruction in the area, that helped with our decision. We thanked everyone that we spoke to and decided we would go to lunch and talk over our findings.

After lunch we made one last stop to Fiscal Court and spoke to Wanda Brown and her staff to see if we could set up our appointment to make our presentation. They checked the record book and set up our appointment October 12th at 2:00PM. Those who would be attending the meeting at the courthouse were the mayor, the county judge, the housing director and council member. The week went by and on October

12 Hunt and Pat Palmer-Ball, Jamie Garey, Neil White and Donnie Meyers loaded Jamie Garey's truck with supplies and shirts and headed to Hazard, Kentucky. The trip takes about 3 hours one way, but the scenery was absolutely gorgeous and the excited group made the time fly by. We arrived in Hazard about 30 minutes before our appointment, so we went in and let them know we were all there and ready to make a lot of faces smile. While we were waiting for the meeting to start, Jamie and Hunt went to the Housing Authorities warehouse and unloaded the truck.

Everyone of any importance was at the meeting. We kept everyone in suspense as to what we were going to present. We had told them of our donation intentions, but we did not tell them the amount. The stage was set for the great reveal, all the people were wearing KYSWAP shirts on including the mayor and, we were getting ready for pictures and the presentation. Pat Palmer-Ball, our treasurer, presented the extralarge replica of a check to the housing director. Pat explained we were just a Kentucky car club but wanted to help those in Hazard as much as we could. Then, she revealed the amount of the check, \$14,000. There were smiles, tears, applause and joy with everyone in the room. They were in disbelief that our car club was so thoughtful and caring for people they did not even know.

Those people in Hazard were so nice, loving, caring and appreciative for what we did for them. The mayor said that they get a lot of pledges and promises all the time, but they don't always come through with the money. That is when Pat handed them the real check.

We truly made a difference. The money is going to a 501C3, and all the money goes to helping with housing, no administrative fees will come out of what we donated. Thanks to everyone for their help. WE DID GOOD!!!


