



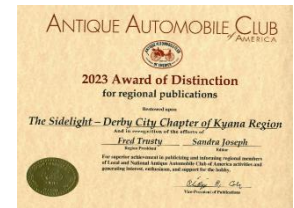

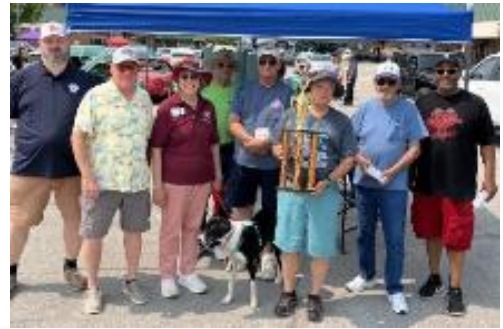
## FROM THE PRESIDENT, MARK KUBANCIK

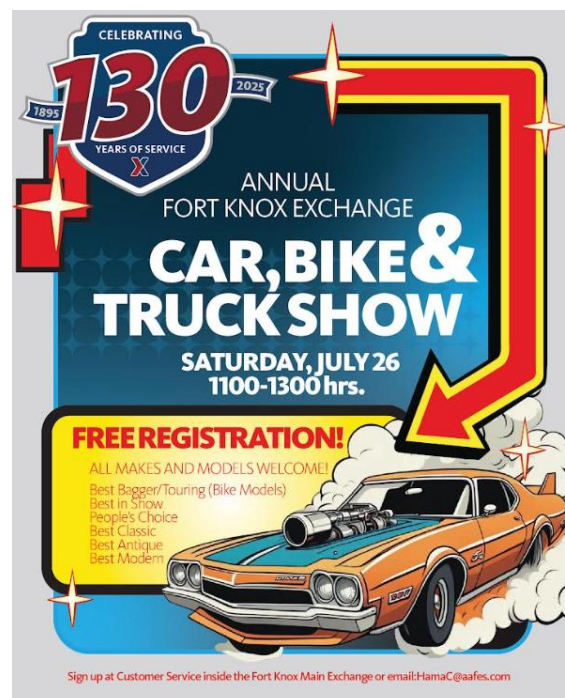

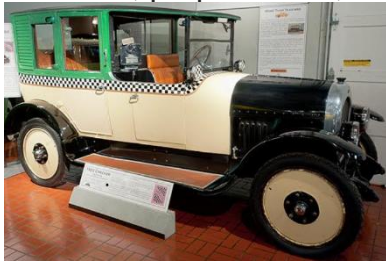


## CHECKER: THE BEST TAXI

### So very practical...but gone...

Checker automobiles were notable as purpose-built taxicabs. Lots of folks still remember these niche-appropriate service vehicles. They were robust taxis and famous for their utilitarian, purpose-built, cab-specific design.

The Checker Cab Manufacturing Company was started in Chicago by Morris Markin in 1921. Competition there between the Checker Taxi and the Yellow Cab Company was overtly fierce and even dangerously so. Thus, following several corporate mergers, Checker later moved to Kalamazoo, MI, and began regular automobile production by 1923. After 1933, E.L. Cord acquired some input into Checker production plans.

Never prominent in the market, they were nevertheless iconic and popular

as excellent taxi-cabs. Checkered "Checker-motif" stripes facilitated their visibility painted prominently on their auto-bodies. Their manufacture was efficient; at least 100,00 taxis were built. Design also focused on passenger comfort and durability. This included an extra-wide rear door entry, spacious back seats, ample legroom, and a large trunk. They had two (2) fold-down, jump seats to accommodate more people (rear-facing, attached to the back of the front seat). The axles were positioned more rearward to gain interior space; they also featured strong, city-traffic-friendly bumpers.

These cars were standard as taxis back in the days during the 1920s to 1980s. Cab companies prominently utilized Checker Taxis in numerous communities throughout this country. During World War II, Checker fabricated lots of military transport equipment.

The company changed its name to Checker Motors in 1958. Besides these commercial vehicles, they were soon available also as conventional passenger cars, called the Checker Marathon. They were never produced in high volume or popular for personal transport ownership. Nevertheless, they emerged as sedans, station wagons, and limousines (in up to 12 seats). Style or manufacture otherwise altered little during all the years of production.

Power was originally provided by a Continental L-head straight 6. Over time other engines include Chevrolet 6s & two V8s, Lycoming, Oldsmobile, and Perkin engines, in gasoline or diesel versions. Modern upgrades included seat belts, headrests, and catalytic converters, etc. The Vatican used Checker Marathons in motorcades for Pope Paul VI.

Unable to compete on the basis of economy of scale production and price, nor being attractively fancy, their market share declined. This was especially true since larger automobile companies offered taxi-type versions of

their sedans, as well as more discounted fleet purchase prices, whereas Checker lacked widely available dealerships. Vehicle production ended in 1982.

The company continued as a subcontractor, automotive parts supplier - especially for Chrysler, Ford, and General Motors. Auto body stamping was a large part of their production. Nevertheless, Checker Motors finally ended in bankruptcy by 2010.

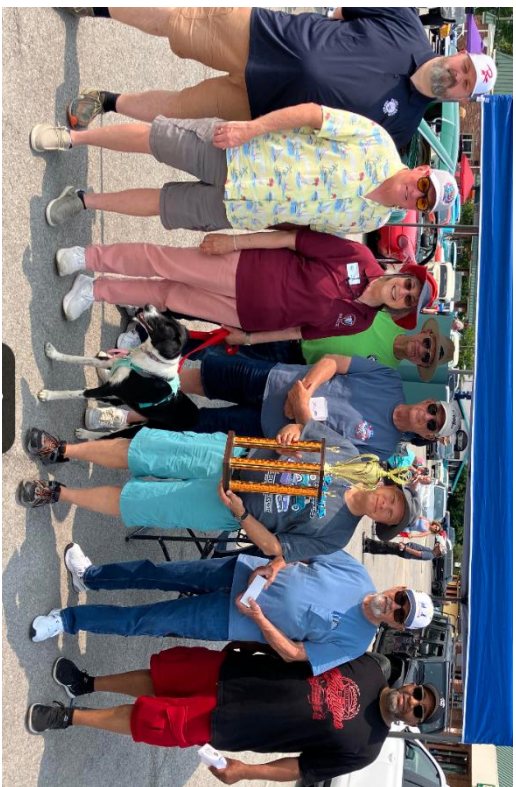
