On April 18-19, after a long weather related delay, the 2026 Bluegrass World of Wheels show finally took place. Unfortunately, it was the same weekend as the Thunder over Louisville Air Show and fireworks display. That, coupled with the cold weather made show attendance low.

That being said, the entries this year were exceptional and the competition for awards was fierce. Again this year, KYANA fielded four excellent entries that provided stiff competition for the other participants. All four entries were awarded trophies for the classes they were in.

The KYANA participants were:

World War II, Automotive Industry Production, and the results.

Japan attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941; four days later Germany and Italy declared war on the U.S.A. We then went to war big time; this created a huge change in our heavy industries. Beginning in 1942, they quickly shifted to massive manufacturing production that helped to win the war for us and our allies; after 1943, this is proudly remembered as the Arsenal of Democracy. What about factory production and our later related US popular car-culture development?

By the early 1900s there had been scores of different automobiles at least temporarily manufactured under many different names throughout this country. Dozens of vehicle companies dropped out of existence in the 1930s. In the early 1940s, production and a US car-culture rapidly accelerated. In 1940, Chevrolet, Ford, and Plymouth alone produced about 1,737,000 cars, in addition to over a million more units for all the other vehicular brands. Just these three most popular ones built about 2,223,000 automobiles in 1941. Then things changed!

During 1942, civilian new car sales were soon halted and passenger automotive production gradually ceased, dropping to just over a million total production, with Chevy, Ford, and Plymouths down to only 558,000 automobiles. US factories revamped into making military hardware and munitions for the war effort. This included an abundance of trucks, jeeps, tanks, ambulances, trailers, ships, boats,

airplanes, gliders, engines, guns, artillery, and other stuff made for our military and shipped to our Allied partners.

Out of left over parts and for various purposes, only 139 cars were reportedly made in 1943 and about 610 during 1944. New car sales nearly disappeared. Automotive ownership of one vehicle per family was already fairly common just prior to World War II. The US population during this time was near to 138,000,000 people. Over those years, about 16 million individuals served our military within this country and/or elsewhere.

Along with the very fast, massive alterations in factory output for the Arsenal of Democracy, came tremendous social shifts too. These changes yielded and resulted in other events, all that widely affected automotive-related life. It was declared that there be Victory Speed with driving limits at 35 mph, designed to save gasoline and tires. Rationing was applied to tires as well, to shift more -rubber to the war effort. Civilians could own only five tires at any time. This was in the day of tube tires that were so puncture-prone, that most families had repair kits accessible to prolong tube life. Tire blow-outs were also frequent but diminished somewhat by the lower speed limit, because slower speeds reduce blow-out failures. Gasoline rationing (usually 4 gallon/week) was also mandated to restrict driving and prompted frequent car-pooling. I remember the stories in later years about

the strict rules to limit gasoline consumption.

Loads of automobiles were not driven much, left in garages, or put up on blocks. Food and some other things were also rationed, which reduced civilian consumption of most everything. People began planting Victory Gardens for home-grown vegetables. Civilians also contributed by purchasing ~\$49 billion in War Bonds, collecting discarded metal, making bandages, and other similar projects with global population support of the war and to each other.

Tons of auto dealerships, mechanic shops, gas stations, and associated businesses were downsized. Employment patterns vastly changed too. Million of male workers were then off in the service or stayed state-side in critical role jobs, e.g., farmers. My wife, Judy's, father was mechanically gifted, so he served in Detroit at the DeSoto factory supervising B-24 Liberator aircraft wing manufacture. Subsequently, some women joined into military service and millions of women moved to enter the industry workforce and maintain production targets. Suddenly females were accepted, recruited, and welcomed into positions at manufacturing positions. They obviously did a fantastic job; that later led to improvement in women's rights, pay, and social equality.

This is famously remembered by the iconic "Rosie the Riveter", a female industrial worker. She became part of our social culture, was widely celebrated

in numerous posters, a popular song, stories, and the media, etc. One real life "Rosie the Riveter" was Rose Will Monroe. She worked at the Willow Run Aircraft Factory in Michigan and was a Pulaski County Kentuckian.



Somewhat similar trends were big population and geographic movements by African Americans. Many joined the US military and lots of others took employment in manufacturing jobs. This helped the personnel numbers in the services and boosted high quantity manufacturing output of war materiel. It also provided better pay and improved their lives and for their families. This too was later followed by some progress toward more rights, racial equality, and integration for African American people generally.

By 1945, the Arsenal of Democracy had yielded a tremendous bonus around the world to win World War II. The amount of military hardware made had been dramatic. Technology, innovation, and efficiency were expanded. Company-sponsored job benefits were emerging. Americans remain proud of this legacy. It had much to do with the U.S.A. becoming the most powerful and prosperous nation in the world.



Of course, lots of people died because of the war; yet, in our

nation's society, civilian life improved. It positively accelerated trends at the rise of the middle class. This resulted in poverty reduction, well-paid jobs available, the GI-bill, more housing, wider education access, greater equality, labor unions, big population movements, and initiated the start of interstate highways, along with our associated growing car-culture.

Auto companies benefited immensely, especially General Motors, Ford, and Chrysler. After the war, however, too many to list here of the other manufacturers could not compete with the Big Three, suffered financially, and ceased production.

The presence of jeep look-alike vehicles to this day is a sign of our fond memories of these Arsenal of Democracy times. It is quite a story.
