
Intermetatarsal Neuroma (Morton's Neuroma)

Pain in the ball of the foot and into the toes

A neuroma is formed when the plantar nerve, which branches between the metatarsal bones, becomes inflamed and enlarged in a benign tumor-like growth. This leads to the nerve becoming fixed and trapped by the metatarsal bones and causes pain. The pain is often described as a burning sensation with tingling and numbness, located under the forefoot and into the toes. It is more common in a foot with a dropped metatarsal arch. Symptoms are worsened with prolonged activity on hard surfaces and with heeled or tight shoes.



To treat this condition the metatarsal bones need to be separated and the forefoot cushioned. This is accomplished by wearing a cushioned custom made orthotic with a metatarsal support which presses between the metatarsals and relieves pressure on the neuroma.
