

- Gain advocates for the SAHS school counseling program








Implications

- Connect with Halos tutoring about presentations
 - Science teachers
- Teacher feedback pre and post survey to assess needs in science classrooms
- Help students understand the importance of pre and post survey completion
- Incentivize students to take the survey
 - Collaborate with teachers


18% decrease in fail grades within the Freshman class in Biology and Environmental Science following counseling interventions.




- Parent A-G workshops




