WORCESTER- George K. Frankian, 91, passed away Wednesday, January 27 in Austin, TX.

His wife of 58 years, Mary (Naroian) Frankian died in 2012. He leaves two children, Charles Frankian, and his wife, Marnie, of Northborough; a daughter, Karen Aroian, and her husband, Mihran, of Austin, TX; four grandchildren, Hasmig and Ani Aroian and William and Samuel Frankian; many nieces and nephews. He was born in Worcester, son of Giragos and Marriam (Danielian) Frankian, and graduated from Worcester Boys Trade School. He was an Army veteran of the Korean War.
