Notice to Exhibitors

The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering these trials, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

The Trial Secretary is not responsible for Emails not received. If you have not received a response to an email after 24 hours, first check your spam folder then call the Trial Secretary by telephone (no calls after 9pm)

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee(s).

Entry fees will not be refunded if the trials cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Since bitches in season are not allowed to compete in AKC Agility Trials, the club will refund all but \$5.00 per day of the entry fee per day for bitches unable to compete for that reason. The club will refund all but \$5.00 per day of the entry fee due to injury that prevents participation. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification from a veterinarian of such a claim before judging commences.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs at show site and all hotel, motel, and campgrounds where they are staying while competing in these trials.

Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run. The judge need not wait for any dog holding up a class. PWCCA has no obligation or responsibility for providing service through a public address system or steward for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought to the ring when required.

Entries must be made on Official AKC Entry Forms and must include the signed Agreement and Rules. Junior Handlers must include their AKC # on the entry form. Please include only AKC titles on your entries.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There is a \$35 returned check fee.

Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may have made such errors. No entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Errors in entries made by the exhibitor cannot be corrected after the closing date. No refunds for duplicate entries.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

PWCCA, the Board, and members will not be liable for any loss or injury which may be sustained through disappearance, loss, theft, communicable disease, parasites, injury and/or death of dogs entered in this event.

PWCCA does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.

Dogs under 4 months of age are not permitted on the show grounds of AKC Agility Trials

Bitches In Season

BITCHES IN SEASON are not allowed to compete. There will be partial refund minus \$5.00 per day due to bitches which come in season after trial has closed, provided that the owner provides a veterinary statement to the trial secretary. All documentation must be received by the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all Pembroke Welsh Corgis over the age of 15 months that are registered with the American Kennel Club, including ILP/PAL registration, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect a dog's physical or mental performance. Refer to Chapter 1 Section 3 of the Agility Regulations for further restrictions.

Height Divisions

Owners are responsible for entering their dogs in the proper height division.

AKC Jump Height Cards

All dogs competing in agility must possess an official AKC Jump Height Card. An official AKC Jump Height Card is defined as either a permanent jump height card, a valid temporary jump height form, copies of two different measuring forms (placing the dog in the same height class) dated on or after the dog's second birthday, or copies of three different measuring forms (two of which place the dog in the same height class) on or after the dog's second birthday. All dogs except those jumping 24" or 26" without jump height cards/forms must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class; this measurement will be valid for the weekend of trials only. If a Volunteer Measuring Official or an Agility Field Rep is present, all dogs without a valid jump height card/form must be measured at some time during the trial. If the dog cannot be measured by the VMO prior to running, it must be measured by the judge before its first run. **You are not required to show your height card or send a copy with your entry. You are required to mark on your entry form if your dog needs to be measured. For more information please visit:**

Paper entries received within the first 24 hours must include postage or be metered. Entries must be delivered by multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS, and DHL. You must waive the signature requirement for delivery services, if applicable. No FAX entries accepted.

All entries must be submitted on official AKC entry forms, one dog per entry form. Photocopies of entry forms without the AKC Agreement are not acceptable. Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are not acceptable.

If you would like confirmation that your entry was received before the trial has closed, please include your email address or enclose a self-addressed stamped postcard.

Entries cannot be changed once the trial has closed. **Please check your entries.**

Entries Online

This trial is accepting online entries through **LabTestedOnline.com**. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be 350 runs online (50%), 350 runs paper (50%) each day. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48-hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one. Coupons or vouchers will be accepted for mailed entries only and cannot be used for online entries. PLEASE CHECK SECRETARY WEBSITE FOR WAITLIST AND RUN AVAILABILITY LabTested in an on-line ENTRY SERVICE only.

Waiting List

A waiting list (30 runs maximum each day) will be maintained for these trials once they have closed on September 21. The waiting list will be active until its deadline Monday, September 28, 6:00 pm CT. Dogs that are entered in these trials at closing and pulled before waiting list deadline will be replaced, if possible, by dogs in order on the waiting list, and the exhibitor will be reimbursed in full. If a dog is pulled but cannot be replaced, the exhibitor will not receive a refund and the dog will be considered absent for the trials. Entry fees for dogs on the waiting list that does not get into the trial by the waiting list closing date will be refunded in full.

Moves to a Higher/Lower /Lateral Class

A move is defined as moving from one level to another within the same class, or moving laterally from Regular to Preferred (or vice versa) in a class.

Moves close at 6pm CT, Monday, September 28, 2026. Moves may be sent by regular mail or email to the Trial Secretary. If an email address is provided with your entry, email confirmation of the move will be sent.

Change of Entry

As described in Chapter 1, Section 21 of the Regulations for Agility Trials, a dog which is entered in a Novice A class for which it is not eligible may be moved to Novice B. In addition, if notification had been received in writing from the AKC after closing that a dog is not eligible for a class entered, the dog may be moved to the correct class. The request for the move must be made at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend

Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A **separate entry form must be submitted** when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Motel & RV Information

All exhibitors must be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs on the motel, RV and trial grounds. Motels require that dogs be crated when unattended. Any damages to motels, RV sites or the trial site can result in disciplinary action by the Event Committee. It is expected that exhibitors will clean up immediately after their own dogs and strongly encourage others to do the same.

You will be responsible for all damage to your room/site and may be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the rules of the AKC. New title rosettes will be awarded to dogs completing an agility title at this trial. Those exhibitors completing a suffix title at the show and who desire recognition at the event may claim a "new title" rosette ringside on the day of the competition.

Dogs receiving an AGCH, MACH or PACH will receive an award bar. Please contact the trial chair at smyour@flash.net if you think you may complete one of these titles at this trial.

PWCCA offers pewter plates with the club seal for first through fourth place in each class in each height division. First in each class receives a 6" Danforth Salad Plate. Second through Fourth in each class receives a 4.5" Danforth Butter Plate.

Those exhibitors completing a prefix title MACH, PACH, AGCH) and who desire recognition may claim their championship rosette at the event it was achieved. No rosette will be mailed.

SPECIAL AGILITY PRIZES

The MACH4 High Flyer Ceridwen CD TD Memorial Challenge Trophy honors Ceri, the first Pembroke Welsh Corgi to earn a MACH. Ceri was bred by Erma and Ralph Kovach and owned by Jane Glier.

The trophy is a framed glass mosaic of Ceri performing weave poles during her MACH run. The mosaic was created and donated to PWCCA by Yvette Huesler. The mosaic sits on a solid walnut base harvested, designed and constructed by Yvette's neighbor, Mark Duberstein.

This trophy is awarded annually at the Pembroke Welsh Corgi Club of America National Specialty Agility Trial. It is awarded to the Pembroke Welsh Corgi that qualifies from both the Excellent/Masters Standard and the Excellent/Masters Jumpers with Weaves classes (preferred classes are not eligible), with the combined most yards per second as determined by the agility trial secretary computer program. For permanent possession, the trophy must be won three times by the identical owner(s), not necessarily with the same dog. The trophy will remain in the possession of the club until it is won outright.

Retired in September 2019 by MACH3 Cibola True Enough HSAs, The Ceri Challenge Trophy was re-donated by Cibola Kennel, Cindy Traylor and Maureen Flaherty. In September 2024, the trophy was won for the third time by AGCH2 MACH39 Croswynd Making Mavericks MXB10 PDB2 MJB10 PJB2 TQX T2B11 CA THDN CGC TKP and Sally Slade. Sally generously returned the trophy to PWCCA.

An Agility Preferred Annual Award is to be given at each PWCCA National Specialty. This award will be offered by the PWCCA and awarded to the Pembroke Welsh Corgi that qualifies from both Excellent/Master Standard Preferred and Excellent/Master Jumpers with Weaves Preferred classes with the combined most yards per second as determined by the agility trial secretary computer program. The winner will receive a rosette and a pewter bowl with the PWCCA seal.

Those exhibitors completing a suffix title at the **National** and who desire recognition at **an** event may claim a "New Title" rosette on the day of competition. Any exhibitor requesting a rosette should be prepared to validate their entitlement. No rosettes will be mailed.

2026 TRIATHLON CHALLENGE

The Triathlon Challenge is a competition to honor the Most Versatile Pembroke at the 2026 National Specialty. Corgi fanciers must pre-register by September 16th, 2026 to participate.

Be aware that not all points listed in this document may be available during specific year's competition. This document lists points available for all AKC classes offered, and the PWCCA may decline to offer the entire roster of potential classes.

COMPETITION RULES

To be eligible, a dog must enter and compete in at least three (3) event categories offered at the National Specialty: herding, agility, obedience, rally and conformation (including sweepstakes and altered class). Any combination of these categories is acceptable. If entered in more than three categories, the top three highest scores earned will be used toward the challenge (except when it comes to breaking any tie score). More than one person throughout the competition may handle the dog.

Dogs participating in these events, even if they do not qualify, earn points. Points, however, are not earned by dogs that are excused for lameness or unacceptable behavior as defined by the rules of that particular event.

Points are awarded for whatever class or combination of classes that earns a dog the most points in each of the events. Three points are awarded for competing in an event. Additional points are awarded for qualifying, or earning a placement ribbon in a conformation class. Some events award additional points for earning a score that is higher than the minimum required to qualify. Some events reward consistency with additional points for qualifying more than once. Some do both. The maximum number of points that may be earned from any event is 20.

All scoring for the top award will be done from the official Judge's book(s) for each event in order to verify the corgi has met the participation requirements (i.e., was not excused). Any errors in scoring **MUST** be reported within 24 hours of the posting of results for that event. If not reported then the score stands.

The dog earning the highest number of points during National Specialty week is the winner of the Triathlon Challenge. Winner of the competition will be announced, and an award presented, at the banquet on Saturday.

NOTE

1. The Triathlon Coordinator, or their designee, maintains all the records for this competition, and is responsible for gathering and recording scores as they are earned by participants.
2. All decisions by the Triathlon Coordinator and/or the National Specialty Performance Coordinator are final.

ENTRIES

Go to the current year's National Specialty page for rules, point schedule and a registration form. Entrants need to return the completed form and applicable fees to the Triathlon Committee by the deadline as identified on the registration form.

CONFORMATION

Most conformation events will add points to a triathlon score. These include Altered Class, Puppy Sweepstakes, Veteran Sweepstakes and the regular/BOB classes. Junior Showmanship, Team, Brace, Stud Dog and Brood Bitch classes do not count towards Triathlon scores.

The highest points earned in any one of these conformation events count toward the Triathlon score.

Points are awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in competition, since dogs entered in conformation do not receive scores. There must be at least one dog defeated in order to earn more than 3 points in conformation. Dogs defeated are determined by the number of dogs entered and shown in a class, not including any dogs excused or disqualified. The maximum number of points awarded to a class dog for any given class is 12.

In classes where ribbons are awarded to fourth place: a win earns the points listed below; second place earns one fewer point, third place earns 2 fewer points, and fourth place earns 3 fewer points, as long as at least one additional dog is defeated.

In classes where only a first place is awarded (e.g. Herding Titled) a win earns the points as below, as long as at least one other dog is defeated.

In classes where dogs are awarded Best and Best Opposite: the Best dog is considered to have defeated all the other dogs in that class, and the Best Opposite is considered to have defeated all other dogs of that sex only (as long as at least one dog was defeated) and points awarded as below.

For class dogs advancing to Winners, Reserve Winners or higher; class points are dropped and the dog is awarded the number of points indicated below. This also applies to Sweeps. Points are not cumulative.

TIE BREAKER

In the event of a tie score, the following criteria shall be used:

1. Points earned in all events (above the three used for the initial calculation) are included in the score.
2. If a tie still exists, or no Corgis competed in more than three (3) events, bonus points will be added to the tied scores based on level of competition in each event the Corgi participated in. The highest class competed in will be used, regardless if that score was used in the original calculation.
3. If a tie exists after step 2, a drawing of identical tokens with one uniquely marked will determine the winner.

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial *or back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner? _____
