Definitions

Wheelbase – The distance between the centers of the front and rear wheels. Wheel base is recorded in inches

Where to find:

1. Driver Door Jamb Certification Label
2. Original build/spec sheet
3. OEM brochure/body-builder specs
4. Registration paperwork

BBC (Bumper to back of cab) – A linear distance measured from a truck's front bumper to the back of its cab. Abbreviated to BBC.

Where to find:

1. OEM spec pages / brochures
2. Body Builder Manuals
3. Dealers build/spec sheets:

Conditions – The four condition levels available in the Price Digests application are:

1. **Excellent (Adds 25%):** New Condition with no evidence of wear.
2. **Very Good (Adds 15%):** Well above average. Vehicles with this rating typically have low use hours, are clean and properly maintained, and there are no mechanical or cosmetic repairs needed.
3. **Good (Default):** Vehicle are clean, attractive, and in a saleable condition. Typically, mechanically sound with average hours and no repairs needed.
4. **Fair (Subtracts 15%):** Vehicle has areas that are worn and faded, even after cleanup. Scratches and chips in paint evident. Typically has some mechanical repairs needed, with high use hours on the downside of life expectancy.
5. **Poor:** Not acceptable for our program

Non-Owned Trailer – Pays for physical damage to a non-owned trailer in your care, custody, control while you are using it. Applies only while attached to your covered power unit.

YOE (Years of Experience) – how many years of continuous commercial driving experience without a lapse.

DOH (Date of Hire) – most current date driver was hired.

O/O – Owner/operator or independent contractor.

Sleeper Type –

Where to find:

1. Driver door jamb certification / spec label
2. Original dealers build/spec sheet:
3. Owner's manual or trim/data labels (sometimes behind the passenger seat or on the bunk base).

Decode by sight (if paperwork's missing):

- **Integrated vs. box/stand-up conversion:** Integrated sleepers flow with the cab; add-on box sleepers have a visible seam.
- **Roof height:**
 - Flat/Flat-top – no raised roof.
 - Mid-roof – moderate crown; usually no full stand-up height.
 - Raised/High-roof – tall stand-up roof, fairings/deflector often present.
- **Common size (model names):**
 - Freightliner: 60", 72" RR (Raised Roof), XT variants.
 - Kenworth: 52", 62", 72", 76" (MR = Mid-Roof; HR/RR = High/Raised Roof).
 - Peterbilt: 44", 58", 72", 80" (e.g., UltraLoft).
 - Volvo: VNL 640/740/760/860 families (bigger number = larger, taller sleeper)
 - Mack: Anthem- 48" Flat-Top and 70" Stand-Up; Pinnacle (legacy highway model): 48" & 56" Flat-Top, plus 60" mid-rise and 70" mid/high-rise sleepers
 - International (Navistar): LT Series with 73" Sky-Rise
 - Western Star: 57X on highway flagship with 60" and 72" sleepers (single or dual bunk options shown in spec sheets)
