# **The Monache High School Marauder Band: Who Are We?**

The Monache High School Marauder Band was founded in 1969 under the direction of Mr. Dale Anderson. The Marauder Band was built on a foundation of musical excellence and class, which we still uphold to this day.

**The Monache High School Marauder Band:** This is the top performing group at Monache High School and consists of members in grades 9-12. Students only gain membership by audition and are required to attend extra rehearsals and performances. Members are expected to uphold high standards of musicianship and should be practicing regularly outside of the school day. Members can expect to be introduced to varying styles and levels of music. During the fall the Band marches and during winter and spring the Band plays concert music. Members can expect to travel 3 times during their four year career at Monache High School. One trip will be a major tour that will be out of state.

**The Monache High School Flag Team:** The color guard at Monache High School will consist of between 20-35 girls who provide color, dance, and class to the Marauder Band. Color Guard Members are expected to attend extra rehearsals, and performances. During the fall marching season they perform with the Marauder Band. During the winter and spring months they learn several styles of dance which is left up to the instructor. They need to see their instructor for any additional requirements. Membership is by audition only.

**The Monache High School Majorettes:** The Monache High School Majorette teams consist of girls in grades 9-12. These young ladies have a rich history and tradition. Several teams from Monache High School have won state titles and have always placed in competition. They need to see their instructor for any additional requirements. Membership is by audition only.

**The Monache High School Winter Percussion Ensemble:** The WPE is an active group in the spring and is open to anyone who has membership in the Marauder Band. This group has one evening practice a week and competes four times a year. Members of this group will fundraise for props and costumes.

# Member Expectations

**Performances:** Performances are like the major exams of the Marauder Band. Members are expected to be on time with all necessary equipment and materials. Each performance has a goal the Band is trying to meet. When we have a member missing it compromises that performance. In the case of an absence it is the member's responsibility to notify the instructor as soon as possible. (Two weeks notice please!) That member will have the responsibility to teach an alternate their spot and will be required to perform their music for Mr. Adams. Students who fail to do the make up performance will receive no points for the performance. Students who miss a performance for any reason should submit an Absence Information form with a parent signature.

**Rehearsals:** Be on time and ready to learn at each rehearsal. It is your responsibility to know where, when and what the next rehearsal is. The rehearsal is an extension of the classroom and it is expected that each student will attend. Each rehearsal has a goal and objective. Sometimes rehearsals will be repetitive but never boring. Members are expected to wear comfortable clothing and athletic shoes. No sandals. Students in sandals will be sent home. Be professional, courteous and respectful - you will be amazed at what we will accomplish. In the case of an absence it is the students responsibility to notify Mr. Adams as soon as possible. Failure to attend rehearsals results in no points earned for that rehearsal. Students who miss rehearsal for any reason should submit an Absence Information Form with a parent signature.

**Daily Participation:** Members should be in class on time, respectful and ready to play. Members also need the following materials in class everyday: instrument, music, a pencil and any other items you need for rehearsal. (Reed players make sure you have at least three reeds at all times.) Members need to respect the teacher and their classmates and listen to instructions. This is a large class and there are temptations to get off task. Remain focused and respectful so the Band can achieve each goal each and every day.

**In Uniform:** Members of the Marauder Band will remain in uniform all day. This includes all suspenders up, jackets zipped and shoes looking neat. You are in the Marauder Band and will be held to a higher standard. This is one of the ways we display our pride and class.

**Respect:** Each member will respect all aspects of the program. This includes the Director, all staff, band parents, equipment, and each other. No one individual is greater than the band. Members of the Marauder Band are professional and courteous.

**Performance: 50 points per performance. Events that have a parade and field performance count as 100 points. Each performance is like a major test and must be made up regardless of the reason for absence. Members of the Band need to contact Mr. Adams as soon as possible to make up the performance. The student has the option of performing the music prepared for the event or preparing a 5- 10 page report on a composer of their choosing. Members who fail to make up the performance will have a grade of 0 for that performance.**

**Tests: 10 points per test, final exam is 50 points. During the fall marching season students must pass 5 memorization tests. Each test consists of one of the following; the Alma Mater, the Star Spangled Banner, the street march, and the field music.**

## When Traveling With the Band

Band trips are an extension of the classroom, with Mr. Adams in charge with parent chaperones assisting. Everyone working together with respect and cooperation makes for a great day!

1. Be on time.
2. An adult chaperone will be on each bus and there will be no changes in buses. Do not stand or change seats while the bus is moving. Sit facing forward at all times. Refrain from raising your voice while on the bus.
3. Buses are to be treated with care. Be sure to place all refuse in the garbage bags provided. Do your part to keep the buses clean. Show respect to our bus drivers!
4. Make sure YOU have loaded your own equipment and instrument and have it ready at the trailer and that you have all necessary items for your performance. You will not be allowed to perform if you are not in complete uniform.
5. No one is to leave the group's area for any reason without the permission of Mr. Adams.
6. Students are to travel in groups of 3 or more and are not to leave the campus or general area for any reason. You are on a class trip, and this means you do not leave the group to be with family.
7. Students are to travel to AND from the competitions on the buses. Students are not to ride home with parents without PRIOR approval from Mr. Adams.
8. **Students can only be released to their parents or guardians on Band events.** (Students cannot be released to older brothers and sisters, aunts and uncles or friends of the family.)
9. Parents should arrange to meet the student at the school when the Band trip is over. Though I am usually fairly close in time estimation, times are only a guide.
10. Private cars will not be used for student transportation.
11. Only MP3/iPOD music players with earphones are allowed on Band functions. No large boom boxes or TVs will be allowed.
12. There is only one way to wear the MHS Band Uniform. All buttons closed, all zippers zipped, and hats or hair pieces on unless otherwise directed. No food or drink (other than water) is allowed while in uniform without permission of the band director.
13. School rules regarding alcohol, smoking and drugs will be strictly enforced.
14. Band members are expected to be in uniform all day. This is a sense of pride and class that has been handed down to us by many generations that wore the Marauder Band uniform. Only in instances of extreme heat will we ever change out of uniform.
15. During field show awards ceremonies, all students AND chaperones are to sit TOGETHER as one group to show unity and spirit. Be sure to use the bathroom facilities prior to the start of high school awards, as you will not be permitted to leave the group during high school awards. We will all sit together and leave together.
16. The MHS Band cheers for all awards and all competitors no matter what the award is. We will be leaders in demonstrating good sportsmanship to all.

Conducting oneself in a safe and respectful manner is always the best policy for anyone. It is expected that all students will conduct themselves in a manner that would not create a situation that causes or could cause physical harm to themselves or others, and/or bring embarrassment or discredit to the Band, school, and community. Each student is expected to be reliable, consistently on time, and loyal to the Band program and their peers. For safety reasons, students are to remain in groups of at least three students when on trips with the music department. It is the student's responsibility to see that he/she has eaten prior to participating in and activities. Skipping meals can lead to unsafe conditions should the student faint while performing.

## **Monache Band Parents Association**

The Monache Band Parents Association is an organization dedicated to the support of the Monache Marauder Band. All parents of current Marauder Band musicians and Color Guard members are considered members of MBPA. Extended family, past Band parents and those who are interested in supporting the Band's activities are welcome to become Friends of the Band.

The nature of the Band necessitates the active involvement of parents. The MBPA is an invaluable part of the success of the Band and without this group's involvement travel and performance for the Band would be extremely difficult. There are many ways parents can become active within the group, with areas to suit any individual's gifts. Just some of the available areas to serve include helping with fitting, maintaining and tailoring of uniforms, sending food items for half-time snacks or meals at events, helping prepare and serve teriyaki, chaperoning the band, serving lunch to our students, helping apply and remove plumes, serving as a member of the Blue Crew by taking equipment on and off the field, and serving on the Board of Directors.

With an annual budget of approximately \$30,000, the MBPA also raises funds for both the Band as a whole and helps students fund-raise for their individual Tour expenses. Through the Fair Share program the MBPA asks each family to contribute either by donation or through fund-raising \$200 annually to meet the general needs of the Band. MBPA is a registered non-profit organization and donations are tax deductible.

The MBPA meets every first Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the Campus Center. Each family is encouraged to have a representative at the monthly meeting. This is the best way to find out what is going on with the Band. It's also a great way to meet some wonderful people, spend some time with your kids and their friends, and become an active part of your child's musical education.
