As we close-out 2021, the state of the Foundation is sound. We intend to hit the ground running in 2022 and build on our first 17 years of service. These successes are primarily due to our faithful donors, the **Friends of Bidwell**, aka the FOB. Other sources of income over the years include:

- Walmart:** \$1,500 to the General Fund
- Discovery Shoppe:** \$10,000 to support the reestablishment of the Bidwell Band and music program.
- North Valley Community Foundation:** \$18,900 to assist Camp Fire survivors enrolled at Bidwell.
- Project Success (NVCF):** \$30,500 over a six-year period. This fund was established anonymously through NVCF to support children without adequate family financial resources - currently 57% of the Bidwell student population.
- Fundraisers:** Sin of Cortez, Japanese Blossoms, Chipotle and Round Table totalling \$5,537.

The Foundation supports the students and educational programs at Bidwell by making cash grants to teachers and staff from the Foundation General Fund. Staff members complete an application describing the items to be purchased, how they are to be used and the cost. Each application is then reviewed by the Board at a monthly meeting, approving or denying the request.

In addition to the aforementioned financial actions, the Board established a memorial endowment in honor of teacher John Schulz and long-time staff and BJHS Foundation Treasurer, Linda Wilbur. (continued on back)

Your Donations Making a Difference!

The BJHS Foundation Board approved 25 staff requested grants in 2021. Thirteen grants were funded by the donations of the F.O.B. The Project Success and Camp Fire grant proposals approved by the North Valley Community Foundation's Chico Children's Endowment fund and Butte Strong fund financed the remaining twelve. These grants provided school supplies, backpacks, hygiene kits, bus passes, clothing and grocery gift cards to economically disadvantaged, foster or homeless students and families impacted by the Camp Fire. Here are just some of the grants made possible by the F.O.B.:

- Computer workstation podium with wheels
- Organizational tools for science department curricula and lab materials.
- Sound machine to insure privacy during counseling sessions. Timers to keep track of time during counseling sessions. (continued on back)

THANKS FOB (cont.) The stated purpose of **The John Schulz and Linda Wilbur Endowment** is to grow the principal amount of the Fund to the level that the interest and dividends can be used as a permanent source of funding for the Foundation. The Endowment grows with donations from FOBs, annual dividends and interest payments, as well as periodic transfers from the Foundation General Fund. The current value of the Endowment is **\$58,213.53**.

The need for classroom/program financial support and individual students in need has grown, especially over the last five years. We are grateful for the donations from the Friends of Bidwell which have kept pace with the Board's efforts to fund requests for classroom and school educational programs. Grants to the Board from the North Valley Community Foundation and fundraisers have also contributed significantly to school success for scores of Bidwell students in need. We look forward to continuing our work in 2022.
