

Subject: Presidential Pardon Power

Text:

"The President's pardon power is not absolute.

"No President may self-pardon, pardon for prospective acts, grant a pardon to obstruct or evade justice, or pardon a close family member (defined as father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, niece, husband, wife, fatherin-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, stepfather, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother, or half-sister).

"All pardons must be announced in the Federal Register and can be nullified within a period of seven days following the announcement by either a majority of senators of the President's political party or a majority of senators of the largest opposition party."
