## Instructions -

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Color as per the colored picture. Use the attached plain copy to test colors first before coloring stitched version. There are detailed up close pictures for the bling placement and these will provide better views on coloring.

You do not need to use fabric medium on the markers.
HEAT SET WITH PRESS CLOTH! Color before setting bling.
Bling Kit (all the stones necessary to bling according to the photo included in kit. Please note that there are just a few extra stones of each color so be careful when handling the rhinestones).

Iron or Mini Iron. The best way to attach most of these stones is with a mini iron preferably one that has a rhinestone tip. A regular iron can be used but may prove to be cumbersome when setting the very smallest stones.

Pair of tweezers for placing the stones. Any tweezer will do but I find that embroidery tweezers or medical supply tweezers at least $4.5^{\prime \prime}$ long work the best.

Roxanne's Baste it with the small nozzle for precise glue placement. Although the stones are all hot fix (meaning that the glue on the stone is activated by heat), I found it somewhat easier to put a spot of Roxanne's Baste it glue down, place the stone on the glue then let the glue dry (for about 5 minutes). Then hit the stone with your iron or mini iron. The Baste it glue holds the stone exactly where you want so you can place the iron on it without worry of the stone shifting under the iron.

There is no particular step by step process other than it is easier to color first then place the stones. The photo(s) included should be the best guide for coloring as well as where exactly to place stones. However, there are detailed diagrams of each part of the design labeled with number associated with a particular stone. Please see the Excel spreadsheet printout for the rhinestone name, the size and the color code for each stone. I have also provided a close count of how many stones are used throughout the process.

If you are having difficulty setting the stones (i.e., they don't seem to stick once heat activated) you may want to refer to the VERY DETAILED instructions provided by the following link:

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Coloring: Use Sun Yellow in the Head Feathers deepening the color as you color towards the head.

Coloring: Starting with the top area above the eye, color the feathers in this order:

1. First 3 rows, color with Shiraz
2. $4^{\text {th }}$ row color with Poppy Red
3. $5^{\text {th }}$ row color with Burnt Orange
4. $6^{\text {th }}$ row color with Tangerine
5. $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ row color with Sicilian Yellow
6. For the remainder of the rows, color using Sun Yellow. You should color the first few rows very intensely and then color lighter as you move down the rows. There should only be a faint hint of color in the last row.

The collar around the neck should be colored with Tangerine on either ends with Sicilian Yellow in the center. The two curved areas under the collar use Burnt Orange.

The center circles on the shoulder use Sicilian Yellow, the second area use Dark Aquamarine then Deep Blue/Dark Aquamarine for last circular area of shoulder. Use Dark Aquamarine in small diamond areas.

Body and wings of Cockatoo are colored in Sun Yellow. NOTE: Sometimes the easiest way to color is to mix up a large Dixie cup of fabric medium and break off a chunk of your Sun Yellow pencil into the fabric medium. Let it sit for about 15-20 minutes then mix it up. You will get tinted fabric medium that you can color the body and wings for faster coverage.

## Color beak with Charcoal grey

Color face with Sicilian Yellow
Refer to pictures in Bling Section for further clarification of coloring.


## Edges/borders of wings and center medallion second border color in Deep Blue

Center of medallion and small curls on medallion color very lightly with Beech or Spring Green
Outer border, large curls triangular areas in medallion color with various shades of Dark Aquamarine
Color areas next to wings with shades of Dark Aquamarine
Color band under medallion with Tangerine
Color second band under medallion with Burnt Orange
Color two areas above claws in Sun Yellow
Refer to pictures in Bling Section for further clarification of coloring.


## Color Claws with Charcoal Grey

Color branch with Beech or Spring Green
Color Center tail feathers with Tangerine and Sicilian Yellow
Color outside tail feathers with Sun Yellow shading the color as seen in picture in Bling section.
Refer to pictures in Bling Section for further clarification of coloring.

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Bling:
Bling: Lemon (1) Topaz(2) Jonquil (3) Blend the three stone colors as per the picture



Bling:

1. First 3 rows, use Burgandy (4)
2. $4^{\text {th }}$ row use Siam (5)
3. $5^{\text {th }}$ row use Hyacinth (6)
4. $6^{\text {th }}$ and $7^{\text {th }}$ row use Sun (7)
5. $8^{\text {th }}$ row Use Smoked Topaz (8)
6. $9^{\text {th }}$ row use Topaz (2)
7. 10 th $\& 11^{\text {th }}$ row use Lemon (1)
8. $12^{\text {th }}$ row use Jonquil (3)
9. For the remainder of the rows, use Crystal (9).

Animals Gone Zen Block 2 - Cockatoo Instructions
Neck collar: Start with Hyacinth (6) then use Topaz (2) in the center of collar.


1. Use Lemon (18) to outline wings and body of Cockatoo.
2. Use Emerald (10) in the center of diamond shapes under collar.
3. Use Citrine (12) in center circles on shoulders then Blue Zircon (13) in outer circular band on shoulder.
4. Use Blue Zircon (14) in center of medallion of Cockatoo chest.
5. Use Aquamarine (15) in triangular parts of medallion.
6. Use Emerald $A B$ (16) in swirls above medallion.
7. Use Tangerine (17) in the orange band under medallion.
8. Use Venus (11) in $2^{\text {nd }}$ band under medallion.

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2. Place Hyacinth (6) at the end of feather lines as seen in picture.
