- This block is considered to be an intermediate level. Prior fabric coloring/painting experience is recommended.
- This block is primarily colored with Inktense pencils but any watercolor pencil with fabric medium will work.
- The background has been painted with a blend of crushed Sicilian Yellow Inktense block and fabric medium. I have posted several videos on YouTube on how to create your own fabric paint using Inktense pencils and/or watercolor pencils. If you prefer, you can use a watercolor concentrate mixed with fabric medium that can be painted on as well.

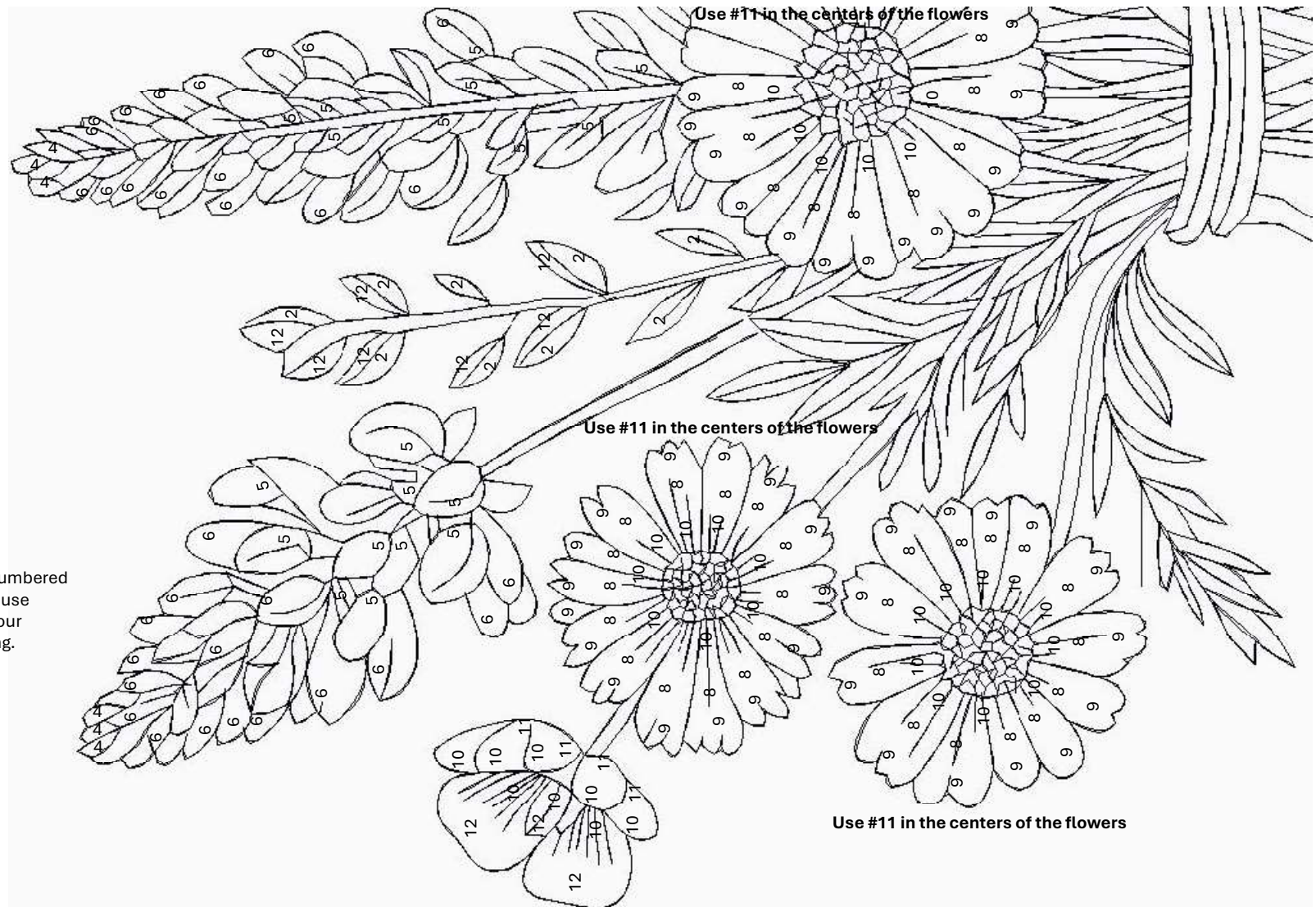

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All stems have been colored with #3.
 For all the various leaves, use #2 first then
 Overcolor with #1. You can mix in a bit
 Of #3 if you wish to color the leaves darker.

Use #7 for all areas in the bluebonnets not numbered
 By #5 or #6. Once all the petals are colored, use
 The fabric medium to blend together using your
 Brush from the lightest to the darkest coloring.

Use #11 in the centers of the flowers

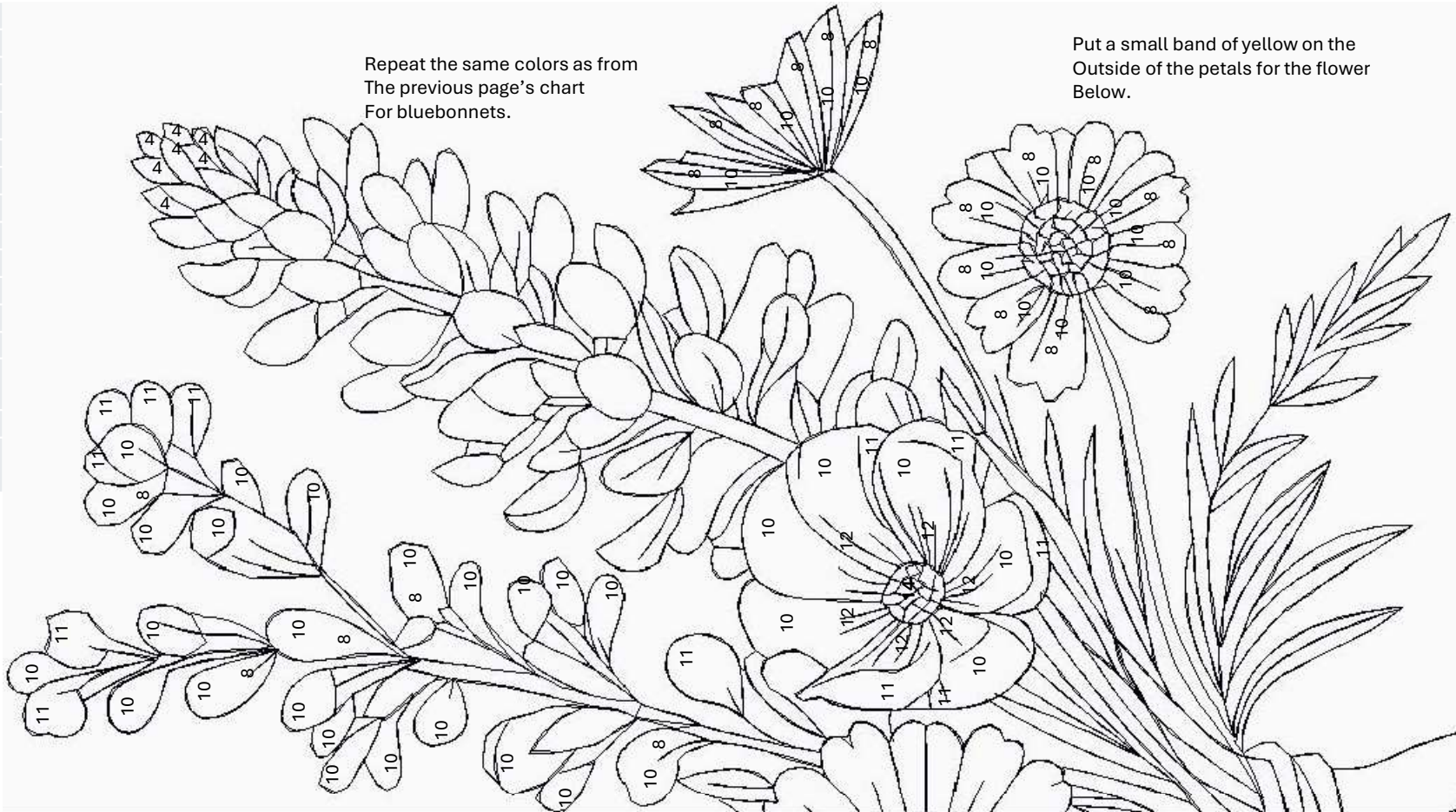
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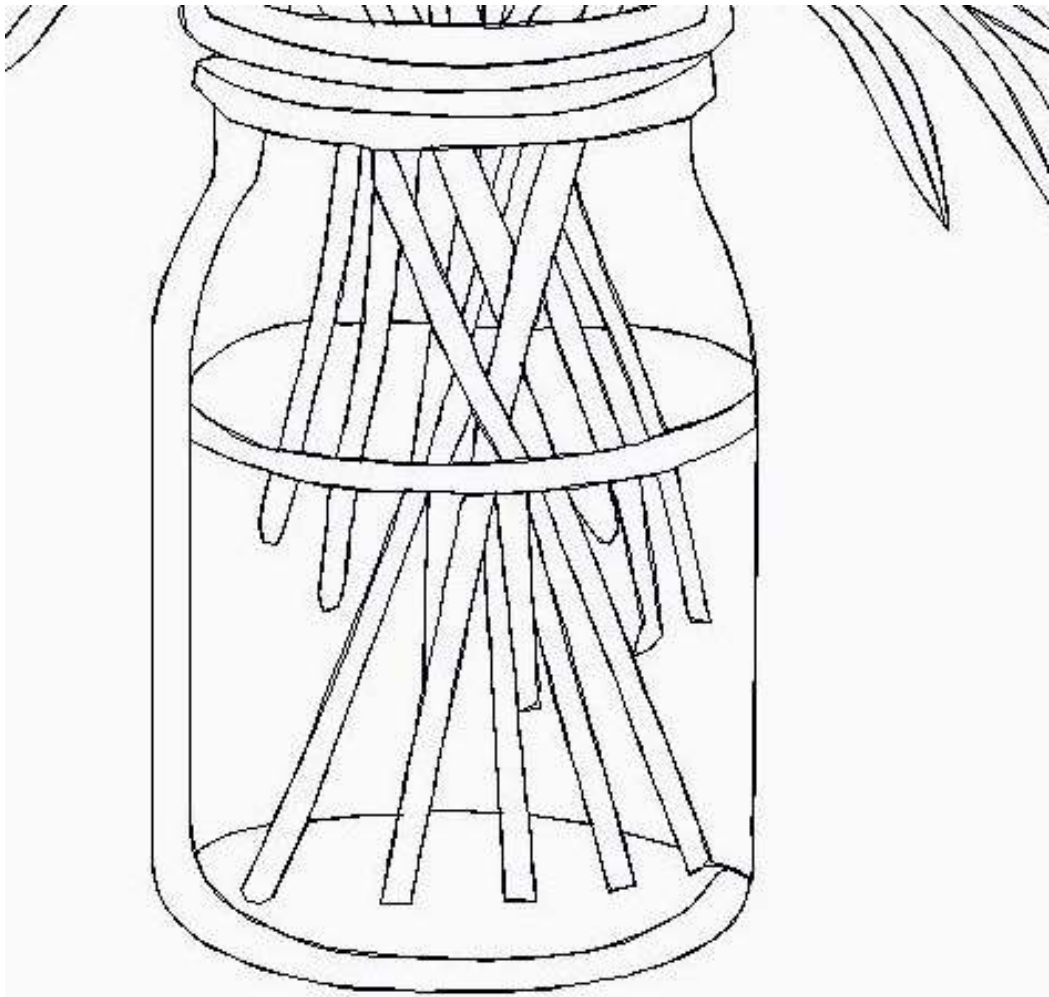
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Repeat the same colors as from
The previous page's chart
For bluebonnets.

Put a small band of yellow on the
Outside of the petals for the flower
Below.



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For the stems in the jar, color them all With #1.

For the water in the jar, use #6. Easiest way is to use some pencil shavings in a paint palette Pot and mix it with fabric medium to create a Pale blue color. Then paint over the stems (making Sure they are dry first) up to the water line on the jar.

Then use #4 along the rim of the jar just in the center. Create a paint with #13 making sure to achieve an Almost pastel color of aqua then paint the entire Jar (including water and stems) You may want to Use the pencil lightly on the rim as well as the jar Outline and darken those areas a bit.

Once your work is completely dry, paint over the entire Background with the pale yellow paint made from the Sicilian Yellow Inktense pencil (you will need about 1 ounce of paint). While the paint is still damp, color the Area under the jar with #14 lightly then blend. Please refer To colored picture to see where to color.
