MBRA March 13th Meeting Notes

Mary Wilkerson, President, called the meeting to order at 7:31pm. Our first speaker of the evening was Marshall District Supervisor Mary Leigh McDaniel. She gave an update about the proposed 2019 budget. The County's first and only public hearing will be Thursday, March 15th at 7:00pm at Fauguier High School. Mary Leigh explained that a new Warrenton Library is also a hot topic; many people support construction of a new library but some do not. The PATH Foundation donated \$1 million, the Town of Warrenton donated \$1 million, and the community donated \$3 million for it so that the County could have \$10 million. Mary Leigh said the Board of Supervisors (BOS) was reluctant to commit the \$10 million.

As for the budget, Mary Leigh said that most of the increases are related to public safety and schools: fire, schools, utilities, and the Sheriff's Department, for example. She said there has been a lot of anxiety over the proposed increases, which would mean a 17% average increase on residential, 5% on commercial, and 4% or 5% on farmland. The County will reduce the tax rate.

- 1) Public Safety: They are looking at hiring new rescue workers primarily because response times in rural areas are much slower. They want to supplement people in order to improve response times. Currently, Orlean and Marshall fire departments work together so that people in the middle of the two areas get covered.
- 2) Public Health: The County has decided to send to bid the sewer in Catlett. That will help the County get more economic development.

The proposed budget only gives Fauguier County schools half of what they are asking for. Mary Leigh explained that this is budget is a 2-year plan, and that the County also has a 5-year plan and a 10-year strategic plan. They will also do a budget next year because they are required by law to do one every year. Mary Leigh said that feedback is very important for the BOS to make a decision on the budget. The best way to comment on the budget issue is to either speak at the public hearing or email the BOS. She said the County wants to be responsible with what they have to fund, which is fire and rescue, etc. The Proposed Budget is up on the County Website. March 19th will be the BOS's mark up/mark down work session. On March 22nd, they will vote on and pass the budget.

Supervisor Mary Leigh McDaniel then introduced our final speaker of the night, Fauquier County School Superintendent Dr. David Jeck.

Superintendent Dr. Jeck asked that we all support the school's budget proposal and understand where they are coming from. He explained that they have not had a fully funded budget in the five years that he has been with Fauquier's school system. A mantra they started last year is that we want to be heroes; we can be heroes, villains, or victims, but villain and victim are both loser positions. Dr. Jeck wants public safety funded and does not want to pit the County's agencies against one another.

The number one thing students would want to have if money were no object is better food. They also would want to have more technology and to pay teachers more.

Dr. Jeck said this is the most he has ever proposed to the County in funding. He is required by law to provide a needs-based budget, and he feels that this proposal is needs-based. Included in the school's proposal is a 3% raise for all employees, which would cost over \$3 million. \$500,000 of whatever is awarded to the school system is lopped off the top for students with severe emotional disabilities/issues.

He asks that we do the math and figure out what stays and what goes. He believes that some must-haves are new buses, fuel, pay costs, and school maintenance costs. The school administration received ninety-two budget requests. He said they are basically at poverty, and recently had a \$150,000 cut due to loss of federal funding.

Dr. Jeck has been in Fauquier for 5 years and spent 19 years in Charlottesville prior to Fauquier. Fauquier County schools have a 96% graduation rate and some of the highest AP enrollments and SAT scores in the state.

He said there is a strong sense of community in this County, and when all other agencies/entities are funded, our kids benefit. At the last School Board budget hearing, there were no citizens who spoke, which was disappointing but he understands that people usually go to the Board of Supervisors Public Hearing to speak.

Because of the smaller class sizes in Fauquier County schools, Fauquier spends more financially per pupil than other areas spend. Our smaller class sizes are a calling card for us. Our typical class size is twenty-two students, whereas Prince William County's is thirty-one to thirty-two.

Student population has been stable the last few years. Three factors are examined in determining future student populations:
1) live births, 2) a Weldon Cooper population analysis system from UVA, and 3) the number of roofs going up in the County. For example, 500 homes would translate to 350 students. They are not projecting much growth in the next few years; many kids who grow up here and move away will not be replaced.

Five teaching positions are already grantfunded. He discussed the downside to hefty grant-funding.

Student Walkouts: He said that while we are a conservative community, it makes sense to him to give these kids 17 minutes to say, "hear us." He feels it is important for them to learn self-advocacy. He said it is not a political thing for these kids. He said it is political to the adults. For the kids, they are just asking what is the plan, what are you doing to protect us?

Dr. Jeck explained that we are about to see a complete overhaul in the education system in Virginia. For years, it has all been about teaching for standardized testing. Now, Virginia has learned that has not worked and it has been a disservice to our students. This overhaul means fewer tests, more dualenrollment opportunities, and trade-CTE routes. There will be an emphasis on internships, mentoring, and authentic assessments - the opposite of multiple choice tests. Instead, more focus will be on projects and research papers. He said this will be a difficult shift because it is a cultural shift. The timing of this change will impact the incoming 9th grade class.

Jennifer Goldman of the Fauquier Enterprise Center on 8452 Renalds Avenue spoke about the small business center. They provide support, office space, and counseling to small businesses and start-ups. She also announced the Northern Fauquier Business Networking group that meets the second Tuesday of every month at 8am at the Fauquier Enterprise Center. Annual dues are \$40 and that covers their monthly networking meeting. The center is run by Fauquier Economic Development, and has just been branded. Also, they have three offices and a coworking space that they rent.






