# MBRA November 14th Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order at 7:31pm by Secretary Mary-Elizabeth Wilkerson, who led in place of President Mary Wilkerson and Vice President/Treasurer Ursula Baxley who both could not attend.

Marshall District Supervisor Mary Leigh McDaniel could not be in attendance but shared an update via letter which Secretary Mary-Elizabeth read aloud. Mary Leigh reported that the Marshall Code was approved by the Board of Supervisors at their October 12th meeting. The Code is a form based zoning ordinance, customized for the town, that will allow more flexibility in uses than what was allowed under the original C-1 zoning. She said there may be changes and updates to ensure it is working for property owners and citizens, and she thanked everyone for their input on the Code.

On November 12th ground breaking will begin for the new Orlean fire station and new pedestrian crossing signs for Main Street. They are working with VDOT on placement of the signs and solicited ideas. They are also working on a new location and provider for the Hume cell tower after the original provider was terminated in September for lack of performance.

Marshall District School Supervisor Duke Bland spoke. Marshall Middle School's Principal David Graham will soon be moving into a newly established leadership role as Executive Director of Administration and Planning, contingent upon finding a replacement for him as MMS's Principal. Mr. Graham will oversee the school division's transportation, nutrition, and construction and facilities functions. Marshall's loss will be our school system's gain.

<u>Warrenton Middle School: The School</u>
<u>Board still supports a new consolidated</u>
building on the site between the existing
Taylor building and Brumfield. That is the
recommendation of both the A/E
consulting firm and the committee of
community representatives that studied
this for months. Some members of the
BOS want the old WMS renovated to
accommodate 650 plus students, but
some problems are: ingress/egress; 80+
years old; asbestos/ lead abatement; etc.
The S.B. is preparing bids for a design
and turnkey cost for a prototype.

Our first speaker of the night was **Melanie Burch of the Middleburg Humane Foundation.** She does development

work and wears many hats. MHF has been here 23 years, and has a thrift store in Middleburg but is moving it into the Gone to Ground building here in Marshall. MHF's commitment to Marshall is stronger than ever. Although MHF has Middleburg in its name, it is really a Marshall place. They are going to be growing, and will have thrifty and unique pieces in that shop. They may name the thrift store Snazzy. It will be a combination between clothing and plates to having a spread of tack and saddles, as well as something for kids. They are dedicated to reasonably pricing items so that local riders can afford to ride. Lastly, MHF has a huge social media presence. their posts receiving 1,000 to 38,000 views at any given time. They are leading people to Marshall from a 50 mile radius. MHF Board Member Candy Fazakerley spoke as well. She has been a member of MHF's Board of Directors for 5 years now. She has been in the area for 22 years, and was born and raised in Warrenton. She began helping MHF, who has such sweet, kind, scared & abused animals. MHF has the most dedicated group of people. She and her husband are developers; they develop hotel and office buildings in D.C. but do not want that out here.

Lisa and Zohar Ben-Dov gave MHF 23 acres - a wonderful gift! Phase 1 of Marshall: Stables and shed are up. Ricky Brown, a local excavator, has done work for them. Phase 2: Land Development - Water and sewer, road, electric. That's where they are now. They put the design out to 5 contractors, but the most expensive part of the building is the M.E.P. Next, they will pick a contractor and go forward. They hope to have 10 to 12 months to build it. For more info, visit: www.MiddleburgHumane.org

Our last speaker of the night was Glenn Covington, Manager of The Culpeper Farmer's Cooperative Farm & Home Center here in Marshall. He has been manager from 2000 to 2006, and manager of the Farm & Home Center from 2006 to present. In June, Rich Slack from

Kentucky joined the CFC; Rich has been in the feed business for a long time and brings a wealth of information.
CFC is located at 8222 E Main Street.
In 1932, 205 people in Culpeper put \$1,250 each in a pot to form the CFC.
Originally it was formed for the purpose of marketing farmers' crops and products.
They expanded to Marshall in 1979 after buying John Mills' property. Because it is a co-op, we who shop in the store own a piece of it. Now, 512 entities own a piece.
Their Culpeper store has a fertilizer plant and a feed mill.

Glenn started with CFC in Warrenton in 1991, but he always wanted to work at Marshall. He said he gets to work with the grandest people on the planet: professional and hobby farmers, land owners, contractors, etc. In the first ten months of 2017, their vehicles have gone over 40,000 acres and delivered 88,000 tons of dry fertilizer, which would equal 80 train car loads of fertilizer. Also, they have spread 160 million pounds of fertilizer this year.

The feed business drives CFC's business. Their mill puts out 115 tons every day it operates. They design, compose, bag, and bring it up here to their Marshall store. In addition, they purchase \$150,000 in specialty feeds for the store, as well. CFC is different from other places because CFC can actually bring feed to customers. Glenn wanted the CFC to be the place in Northern Virginia for fencing, and he thinks they have become that in the past 17 years. They have three trailer-truck loads of post weekly, and have sold 102,000 fence boards so far this year. Additionally, Glenn wants to provide a discount for MHF's fence. Just about anything you might need is found at CFC: from equine protection to everything needed to raise a beehive. Knowledge and expertise go along with their service. Agriculture is growing and has become so technical that no one can keep up with it; the CFC helps us with that. The meeting was adjourned at 8:40pm

with the Pledge of Allegiance.
