Our cultural standards are different from God's standards. We often rank people by what they have, how powerful they are, or how successful they are. Jesus reminds us that God will not judge us by the same earthly standards. When God asks you, "What have you done with the gifts I have given you?" How will you respond?

Morning Has Broken

"Morning Has Broken" is a hymn with roots in a Scottish Gaelic melody and lyrics by Eleanor Farjeon. It gained widespread popularity through Cat Stevens' 1971 recording, which featured a memorable piano arrangement by Rick Wakeman. The song's lyrics, inspired by the beauty of dawn and the feeling of gratitude, are a celebration of new beginnings and the wonder of creation, drawing on themes from the Genesis creation story.

When Peace Like a River

The phrase "peace like a river" appears in the hymn "It Is Well with My Soul" and also in an African-American spiritual with the same title. The hymn, written by Horatio Spafford, gained prominence after a tragic shipwreck where he lost his daughters. The spiritual, while its exact origin is unknown, uses water imagery to describe the qualities of peace, joy, and love.

God Is On The Move

The song "God Is On The Move" by 7eventh Time Down, released in 2015, is a song about rejoicing in the everyday things and the small steps God takes with us. The song's history is rooted in the band's experiences on a missions trip, where they felt God's presence in a powerful way, and the inspiration came from seeing God's work in the lives of others, both big and small. The song celebrates the everyday victories and the journey of faith, rather than focusing solely on big, dramatic moments.
