"Therefore, every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire." MATTHEW 3:10

Do you bear good fruit for Jesus? Do you spend time in prayer or do you waste it with mindless activity? Do you use your talent to help others or are you too busy? Do you use your treasure to support the Church or do you buy more things that go unused. Our time, talent, and treasure are gifts from God. What we do with these gifts is our gift back to Him. What gifts are you planning to give to the Lord during this upcoming Christmas season?

Light One Candle

The hymn "Light One Candle" was written by Peter Yarrow in 1982 as a pacifist response to the 1982 Lebanon War, though its lyrics were inspired by the Maccabees' revolt and the themes of Hanukkah. The song became a popular Hanukkah song, but its message is broader, incorporating themes of peace, resilience, and the universal struggle for justice.

On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry"

The hymn "On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry" originated in 1736 as a Latin hymn by Charles Coffin, a French rector at the University of Paris. It was translated into English by John Chandler in 1837 and is a popular Advent hymn, drawing on the biblical account of John the Baptist calling people to prepare for the arrival of Jesus Christ.

O Come. O Come. Emmanuel

The hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" originated from 12th-century Latin texts based on the 8th-century "O Antiphons," which are a series of prophetic titles for the Messiah used during the final days of Advent. The text was translated into English in the mid-1800s by John Mason Neale. The familiar tune, "Veni Emmanuel," is thought to have been a 15th-century French funeral hymn.

Mourning Into Dancing

The story behind the song "Mourning into Dancing" is inspired by the biblical passage Psalm 30:11-12, which talks about God turning sorrow into joy. It was written during a time of personal grief and involves being part of a worship dance ministry, leading to the message that even in the midst of pain, one can find hope and believe that Jesus will eventually bring new joy.
