Practicing the Spiritual Principle of Humility

Humility can be defined as the absence of pride or arrogance.

The Benefits of Humility: Comfort for the soul. Enhanced leadership capabilities. Greater self-discipline. Improved job performance. Higher academic grades. Decreased prejudice. Thriving relationships.

The Importance of Humility: t increases compassion and empathy. Individuals who embody humility are more inclined to respect and value the beliefs and opinions of others.

What are instances of Humility? 1. You refrain from considering yourself superior to others. 2. You are aware of your limitations. 3. You abstain from boasting. 4. You recognize that there is always room for improvement and development. 5. You graciously express gratitude. 6. You acknowledge when you lack knowledge on a subject.

Humility grants a clear perception of ourselves, encompassing both our shortcomings and strengths. This self-awareness enables us to identify areas that require growth and allows us to place our trust in God during the process.

Bible Verses: According to Proverbs 11:2, "*With humility comes wisdom*" and Romans 12:16 states "*Live in harmony with one another*".

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling

Written by Charles Wesley in 1747, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" was published in *Hymns for those that Seek, and those that Have Redemption* to reflect themes of sanctification, the Holy Spirit, and the desire for divine love to dwell within the believer. It is a theological prayer for spiritual transformation, designed to encourage Christians on their journey toward holiness.

Build a Longer Table

"Build a Longer Table," written by [Dave Bjorlin](#), is a modern hymn from his collection *Protest of Praise*, designed to address contemporary injustices and the need for radical hospitality. It is inspired by the theological concept of "building a longer table, not a higher fence"—a phrase popularized by Fr. Gregory Boyle to combat exclusion and promote sharing abundance with those on the margins.

Rise Up, O Saints of God

"Rise Up, O Men of God" was written in 1911 by American Presbyterian pastor [William Pierson Merrill](#) to encourage a burgeoning men's movement within the church. Inspired by a need for a "brotherhood hymn" and an article called "The Church of the Strong Men," the words came to him on a Lake Michigan steamer.

How do we apply these to our daily life

Micah 6:1-8 What does God require of us? Note the word is “require” – not ask, not request but *require*. How often do you think about God REQUIRING something from you?

Psalm 15 The psalmist provides a guide for a virtuous life. How are you doing living a blameless life? What ONE thing could you do differently?

1 Corinthians 1:18-31 Paradoxical. Contradictory. Opposite. Out of the box. These are words that can be used to describe Jesus' ministry and God's work in our lives. Does this make it harder to be a Jesus follower?

Matthew 5:1-12 The Beatitudes are confusing, profound, and focused on God's Grace and Kingdom. How well do you understand the Beatitudes?

February 1, 2026 4th Sunday after Epiphany

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.” MATTHEW 5:3

The phrase “poor in spirit” can be confusing. Think of it in this sense – poor in spirit means depending on God's providence and not depending on our own self-reliance. Being detached from earthy things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.

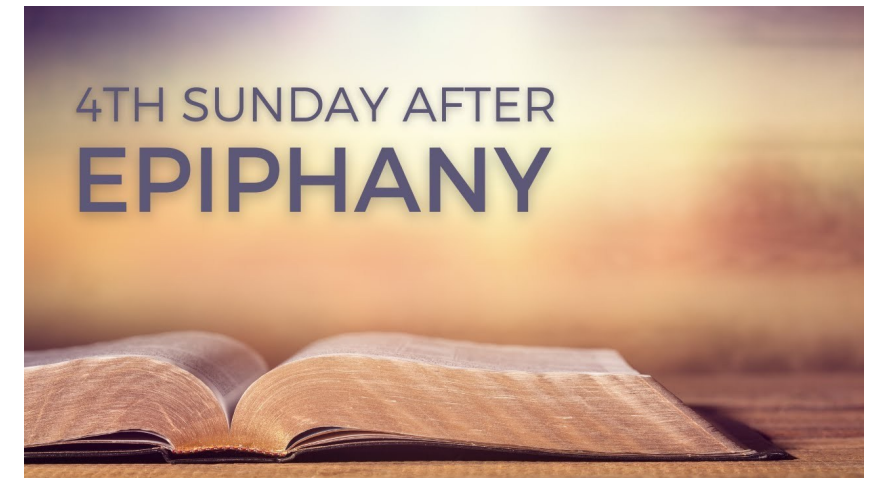
