WARNING! UNCOMFORTABLE STUFF AHEAD.

Money is an uncomfortable topic. Working in a church office for years, I've encountered everything from "When is the next temple talking about money? I will skip church that day" to "I'm going to leave this church - all you do is talk about money." These statements surprise me because talking about money is Biblical. Money is part of our spiritual lives.

Money is frequently mentioned in the Bible. 2,300 verses in the Bible talk about money or possessions. 42% of Jesus' parables deal with money and possessions. Jesus did not avoid the subject - so neither should we. (Check out the article on page 11 that talks about why we are uncomfortable talking about money.) The Bible even provides insights on fundraising.

Apostle Paul talks about money.

Chapters 8-9 in Second Corinthians speak about money and fundraising. Paul makes two theological points: (1) God will provide the means by which the Corinthians may be generous, and (2) the very act of sharing possessions is a way of thanking God for the gifts and blessings one has received. To translate it into today's world, let's look at what The Life Application Study Bible has to say about raising funds:

Holy Faith Last Year vs. This Year

I'm sure you have noticed by now the changes we have made to the summer programming this year. I wanted to take the opportunity to explain the reasoning behind these changes.

Last Year:



Last Year we sent six kids to Luther Crest camp in Alexandria.

Children attended a five day camp and the church paid a total of \$3249 in camperships to cover the cost of their fees.

This Year:



This year we are planning a three day camp at Faith Haven. There is more work involved. However, we are fortunate to get an AMAZING deal from the folks at Faith Haven. Children & adults can attend the camp for \$100. At this time, we are offering to pay half of those fees. We can essentially send 65 kids for the same cost as last year and provide the opportunity for more kids to attend camp at a cost saving to church.

Last Year:



Last Year we invited Luther Crest to the church for a four day Vacation Bible School camp. Ten children attended the camp at a cost of \$3000 to the church.


This Year:



This year we are offering a Mon-Wed camp here at the church from 7:30a-5:30p from the beginning of June to the end of August. Families will pay \$25/day per student and provide a bag lunch. The church will provide breakfast, two snacks per day, "transportation" to and from summer rec and we will be

"transportation" to and from summer rec and we will be completing three vacation bible school programs throughout the summer. We will be able to bring on 25 children and hire several paid staff to help with the camp. Minus expenses the FLCamp should result in an approximate PROFIT of \$8000. This will allow funding for future youth programming and provide a significant service to the community.

New Study Shows Majority of Americans Are Uncomfortable Talking About Finances

Many of us grew up with the conceit that talking about money is rude, and sadly, that thinking persists in American culture. A new survey by Empower found that money talk remains highly taboo. The survey found that 62% don't talk about money – not with their family (63%), not with their friends (75%), and not even with their spouse/partner (46%).

People would rather discuss other potentially flammable topics instead, like politics (43%) and, more morbidly, death (32%), than their finances, according to the survey. So what's the hang-up over talking about money? Why does it make us so uncomfortable?

Protectiveness Over Social Status Perception

According to Brad Klontz, CFP, founder of the Financial Psychology Institute, on a blog by Northwestern Mutual, people may be disinclined to talk about money because they feel vigilant and protective over their social status.

"Money is very tightly linked to our status," Klontz said. "We like to disparage the whole idea of people trying to show status, but it's an ingrained human characteristic. Your concern over your status is one of the reasons you're alive right now because your ancestors passed this onto you."

Fear of Judgment

Klontz went on to explain that fear of being judged is also one hangup holding people back from talking about money. "Either I'm worried you're not going to like me because I have too little, or you're going to judge me because I have more than you," Klontz told Northwestern Mutual. "So we're very hyper-aware of how other people might be looking at us around money."

You Learned Only One Way to Talk About Money - Which is to Not Talk About It

As noted, many of us grew up without money being plainly and comfortably talked about in the home. We may have also inherited what Klontz calls "money scripts", i.e., the concept that talking about money is inappropriate. These money scripts get further ingrained in your psyche as you age, and unless you are actively working to change them, they only further shut the door to money talks.

The stigma around talking about money does appear to be fading, fortunately. Empower's survey found that millennials (56%) and Gen Z (49%) are more willing to talk about money topics than older generations (38% Gen X and 22% Boomers), and twice as likely to say they're an "open book" (28% versus 13%).
